Feast of St Francis of Assisi

Having been in Rome for five days when visiting the basilica at Assisi I wrote in my journal: the "iron and rock of Assisi challenges the gold and marble of Rome". I made my way through the town to the church of St Clare where the cross of San Damiano hangs. It was lunch time and the sisters had locked the church while they had lunch – a striking reminder that first and foremost this is a religious community, not a tourist destination.

I was into that church as soon as the church door opened, and spent time in wonder before the cross of San Damiano, marvelling that this was the very same cross from which the young Francis heard the words, "Francis, repair my house, which, as you can see, is in ruins". Very soon it dawned on him that God was giving him directions to do more than repair a small chapel, but to repair a ruined Church; a Church described by one biographer as wracked by "heresy, immorality and simony". Francis was to have considerable influence at the Fourth Lateran Council: Francis wasn't all "brother sun and sister moon", he knew how to play the game of Church politics.

As I left Assisi, I bought each of the members of my family a "lucky monk": small figurines depicting monks and/or nuns eating and drinking and generally having a great time.



Because despite teaching that we need to embrace poverty, and we all need to kiss the leper and hug the wolf within each of us, Francis also taught and lived joyously.

TIME CAPSULE. – Fragments from the History of Our Parish.

No.2. St. Joseph's Church in Ohariu Valley, 1875.

The following report appeared in the Wellington daily newspaper, the New Zealand Times, on 6 July 1875.

The Roman Catholic population of the Ohariu district have recently been making very strenuous efforts to raise sufficient money wherewith to erect a new church, and so far have their praiseworthy endeavours been successful that a tender for the performance of the work has within the past few days been accepted. By a sight of the plans, which have been drawn by Mr. Turnbull, of Temple Chambers, we learn that the building it is proposed to erect will be capitally adapted to the wants of the district, and from an architectural point of view quite an ornament to the valley. The structure will be about 40ft, by 20ft, and 12ft, high, and capable of seating about two hundred persons. In addition to the nave, which is to be 30ft, by 20ft, there will be the usual sanctuary 20ft. by 8ft., and a sacristy 10ft. by 8ft. At the right-hand corner a bell tower, with broach spire above artistically finished, having a cross at top, will rise to an altitude of 51ft. Light will be obtained through four or five lancet-pointed windows. The present contract has been let at £350, but it is intended as soon as possible to lay out another £130 on the building, so as to thoroughly complete it.

For twenty years it was the only Catholic Church within the bounds of the present parish. It was demolished, probably in the late 1930s, but the graveyard remains.
