#### Twenty Third Week Ordinary Time, 4th September 2022 Year C Readings: Wisdom 9:13-18, Philemon 9-10, 12-17, Luke 14: 25-33



Today is Father's Day. It's one thing we all have in common; without someone who fathered us, we would never have come into existence. It's a day to recall and reflect on the lives of our fathers as well as how we live out our own fatherhood.

We all have differing relationships with our fathers and our children. Watching the most recent episode of David Lomas series, *Investigates*, reminded me that some people never get to grow up with their fathers and may not even know who their father is. Some people have complex relationships with their fathers. Those of us who have ourselves fathered children will be aware that we have not always been perfect fathers. Other men find themselves exercising important fathering roles with children they have not fathered – it's not just about genetics!

Today's gospel, coincidentally, talks about fathers (as well as mothers) in the context of what it means to be a faithful disciple: "If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, they cannot be my disciple."

We know that Jesus does not literally mean that we are to hate our parents because the 10 commandments exhort us to honour and love them. Rather, we are today presented with a case of hyperbole – an exaggerated statement that is not meant to be understood literally; the writer of Luke's Gospel, who records these words as coming from Jesus, is teaching us about the cost of discipleship – being willing to give up all that we desire in order to follow Christ.

Fatherhood is, without doubt, one of the many ways in which we men are called to follow Christ. Reflecting on my own experience as a father, the mistakes and learnings along the way, along with the celebrations, cannot be separated from the call to live out my baptismal call and become a better disciple. Certainly, the 'costs' associated with being a discipleship apply when it comes to being a good father.

Paradoxically, when we put Jesus before all else, including family and ourselves, we can only become better fathers (and mothers) and we will only end up having better relationships with our own fathers and mothers, particularly in their old age.

Let's, today, recall the lives of our own fathers – firstly to pray with gratitude for the life they gave us but also, as needed, to pray honestly for forgiveness and/or the courage to forgive them. And, if they are still alive, follow up that prayer with some appropriate concrete gesture. In this way, as the writer of the book of Wisdom puts it "Thus are the paths of those on earth made straight." **John Kleinsman**

#### Season of Creation 2022 [1st September - 4th October]

The burning bush is the symbol for the Season of Creation 2022.

Today, the prevalence of unnatural fires is a sign of the devasting effects that climate change has on the most vulnerable of our planet. Creation cries out as forest crackle, animals flee, and people are forced to migrate due to the fires of injustice.

On the contrary the fire that called to Moses as he tended the flock on Mt. Horeb did not consume or destroy the bush. This flame of the Spirit revealed God's presence. This holy fire affirmed that God heard the cries of all who suffered and promised to be with us as we followed in faith to our deliverance from injustice.

In this Season of Creation, this symbol of God's Spirit calls us to listen to the voice of Creation.
