Second Week of Advent, 4th December 2022 Year A Readings: Isaiah 11:1-10, Romans 15:4-9, Matthew 3:1-12

Let us pray ...

In his book <u>The Four Signs of a Dynamic Catholic: how engaging 1% of Catholics could change the world</u>, Matthew Kelly (2012) concludes that about 7% of Catholic parishioners are doing almost everything in their faith community and paying almost entirely for the maintenance and mission of the parish. Kelly calls these 'dynamic Catholics'.

Dynamic Catholics have four key characteristics in common, one of them being PRAYER. While dynamic Catholics pray in different ways (Mass; Rosary; meditation; read reflective material, etc) they make prayer a priority and a routine. Advent, the beginning of the Church's year is a good time to look at how we pray.

Kelly provides a process for prayer. It happens daily. Initially a 10 minute commitment, it quickly becomes about 20 minutes, but 10 minutes is the minimum.. It's enlivening, refreshing, and a great process to use. Here it is:

- 1. Gratitude: Begin by thanking God in a personal dialogue for whatever you are most grateful for today.
- 2. Awareness: Revisit the times in the past twenty-four hours when you were and were not the-best-version-of-yourself. Talk to God about these situations and what you learned from them.
- 3. Significant Moments: Identify something you experienced today and explore what God might be trying to say to you through that event (or person).
- 4. Peace: Ask God to forgive you for any wrong you have committed (against yourself, another person, or God) and to fill you with a deep and abiding peace.
- 5. Freedom: Speak with God about how God is inviting you to change your life, so that you can experience the freedom to be the-best-version-of-yourself.
- 6. Others: Lift up to God anyone you feel called to pray for today, asking God to bless and guide them.
- 7. Finish by praying the Our Father.

Reflective Thoughts

For those who do not know me, I am Eustie Kamath. I have been in this parish since 2008. I have held many roles in this parish. Today I am the Eucharistic Minister!

But for the grace of God. But for the grace of God, I would not be standing in front of you today. I owe my gratitude to many of you in this community. Some of you are present today, I won't name you. You know who you are. When I needed a place to stay you found me accommodation, when I was lonely you gave me company, when I was in mourning you gave me comfort, when I was feeling down you gave me a shoulder to lean on, when I needed to realign my compass, you walked with me. The list goes on. But, most of all – you made me part of this community, this family.

I have reflected many times why anyone, yes anyone, would reach out to assist someone. The conclusion I have reached is simple - you reach out to assist others because, you let the grace of God flow through you.

Would anyone like the grace of God to flow through you?

I guarantee you, that before the sun sets on today you will come across at least one person whose life you can make at least a little bit better. When you do come across such a person, this is the time you have to answer the question – Am I going to let the grace of God flow through me? Your decision has nothing to do with what organization or group you belong to; what community or parish the person in need belongs to. The grace of God is not parochial!

If you let the grace of God flow through you, someday, someone you have assisted may stand in front of a congregation not very different from this and begin by saying "But for the grace of God, but for the grace of God ..."
