Fifth Week Ordinary Time, 5th February 2023, Year A Readinas: Isaiah 58:7-10, 1 Corinthians 2:1-5, Matthew 5:13-16

"Your light must shine in the sight of all"

As I speak with, and especially listen to parishioners express themselves about the closure of our churches, and our centralisation as a parish into a church that will not look the same as it did, I remind myself that this will not break our faith.

Our faith is, first and foremost in Jesus Christ, who by his death and resurrection enabled the reign of God to burst through, so that it might be 'on earth as it is in heaven'.

The reign of God is no longer mediated through bricks and mortar, the Romans pulled them down in CE70! When our faith is in bricks and mortar, like the Jews of the Old Testament we look inward, to the holy of holies, the place where only men in special garments could go. And where only they could commune with God.

In his ministry and on the cross Jesus was gazing outward, across Jerusalem, Palestine and to the world. His crucifixion was an act of supreme love, and during his ministry he taught us how we too might show that love.

I have been Lay Pastoral Leader in the parish of St Francis of Assisi Ohariu for just on twelve months. I have seen some amazing acts of love and generosity – to name just a few: families supported with food, clothing and furniture; the sick and housebound visited and blessed; the bereaved comforted and consoled; ecumenical services - joining in with other Christians in unity; great liturgies, carefully planned and executed; and hospitality offered and shared. Each and all an opportunity to let the Light of Christ shine.

We may well feel disappointed, perhaps even a bit angry about the property changes. It's then that we need to remind ourselves that the bricks and mortar will fall, but the gaze of Christ from that cross will always be outward. And it'll never be comfortable!

Our Family Friendly Church

People were bringing little children to Jesus for him to place his hands on them, but the disciples rebuked them. When Jesus saw this, he was indignant. He said to them, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these". (Mark, 10: 13-14).



Following a workshop involving members of the Leadership Formation Team, Parish Liturgy Advisory Group & Parish Advisory Group, we are preparing a child friendly space in the church for families.

In short, to ensure a family friendly church.

What might a family friendly church look like?:

- Most importantly we will welcome families to Sunday Mass.
- We will do our best to make families feel comfortable at Sunday Mass.
- Children are children, so while we teach them to grow into adult worshippers, we accept that they might do child type things. We will be patient with them when they do that.
- The Sunday Mass is the key time that the Catholic community gathers. Therefore, we need to accept that there might be a level of noise as people and families greet each other. This is not a quiet contemplative time. If you are someone who likes to prepare for Mass with quiet contemplation, perhaps set time aside at home before you come to the church.
- At the same time, we will be providing a carpeted area in the hall space at the church for families who do like to take their children to one side, or feel the need to let them do some activity for a bit.
- This 12 square meter of carpet will have books and colouring type activities. Toys present a hygiene challenge in the current age, so we won't supply any at this stage.

• "Liturgy begins in the carpark" – we will greet and welcome each other, including children and young people, with a smile.

Children, young people and families, are not the "future of the Church", they are already an important part of the Church! We want them to feel welcome to join in the Sunday Mass.

How will we know when we are a family friendly church? When people say: "Go to St Francis of Assisi Ohariu, they really welcome families there – they really understand what it's like to have young children."

As we settle into our parish church at Johnsonville, we will be looking to introduce other family friendly initiatives.
