Live What You Preach So You Don't Have To Preach!





'Why don't you practice what you preach'? Have you ever said those words? Maybe someone has said them to you.

Hypocrites are people who pretend to be something they are not. They may say one thing and then do the opposite. They may act one way in a certain setting and then act another way in a different setting.

How do we practice what we preach? One way is to be careful about the words we speak. You can tell a lot about a person by the words they use.

You can tell even more by the words they use when they are distressed, angry, or threatened. James 3, tells us the tongue is very dangerous. It can set a great forest ablaze. We can tame all kinds of animals, but we cannot tame the tongue (James 3:3-6).



People are listening to the words we speak. Do our words build people up or cut them down? Do our words bring peace and calm to a situation or do they add fuel to the fire? The words we speak should match the person we claim to be. If we profess that we are followers of Christ, then our words should be a reflection of that relationship.

We practice what we preach when we live our lives as reflections of the life of Jesus. The way we act at work needs to be the same way we act at home, at church, at school, at college, in the supermarket, in a traffic jam, or waiting for a bus.

The most empowering relationships are those in which we lift the other person to a higher possession of their own being.

Finance Committee – Request for Planned Giving Review

The Finance Committee will be speaking at each Mass on the weekend of 4/5 November, regarding the decreasing income and increasing costs.

When we look at our normal operating costs, those day-to-day expenses the parish incurs such as the levy payable to the Wellington archdiocese for the support of the archdiocese and the clergy, our office staff wages, electricity, normal building maintenance, consumables, etc, and compare them to the level of giving we are receiving, we are forecasting to be short of funds. This forecasting is comparing income to previous years and noting it has decreased, while our costs are increasing – as they are for everyone.

If we compare our forecast planned giving this year with 2018/19, pre COVID, we have a reduction of more than \$70,000 or 24%. This is primarily due to falling mass attendance. This is not unique to our parish, the same thing is happening in other parishes.

At the same time cost of living increases also impact the parish, rates, power, insurance, repairs and maintenance just as they do for you at home.

The table (**Table A)** over the page is to assist you with considering increasing your current planned giving.

By having a donation number, we will supply a tax certificate each year so you can claim the tax refund of 33 cents back in each dollar of every donation made.

The Finance Committee is also reviewing costs including staff costs, along with other income such as rentals. It is important to note that the proceeds from any future sale of buildings will be kept specifically for the parish church building costs and not for the day to day running of the parish, which needs to be funded by weekly income.

The Finance Committee would like to thank you for your ongoing financial support to help keep this parish viable as well as vibrant.
