Transfiguration of the Lord 6th August 2023, Year A Readings:: Daniel 7:9-10,13-14, Peter 1:16-19, Matthew 17:1-9



Transfiguration of the Lord

Moments of transfiguration whether for Old Testament prophets, mystics or ourselves reveal the sacramental nature of the world that surrounds us.

For Moses it was the burning bush; for the 20th Century contemplative Thomas Merton it was an ordinary street corner, that can become an instrument for an encounter with God, just as in the sacraments, ordinary objects like bread and wine and water become charged with God's transformative power.

In fact, the whole of creation can reveal God to us in this sacramental way. While we may seek out sacred places, because they 'tune' us more readily to experience God's presence, God is not limited to these distant places. God can just as well be seen on a street corner as at a cathedral. If we can but learn to see it, everywhere we look is ablaze with the glory of God.

The good news is that we can learn to see this glory and recognise it. All of us can develop our inner eye simply by practicing the presence of God in everything. And this practice can help us to develop and grow, comes about in ordinary places, through ordinary activities.

We don't necessarily have to go to the monastery, or to the mountain top, or any particular place. Even Jesus tells us "Go into your room, close the door, and pray to your Father who sees in secret" (Matthew 6:6).

Practicing the presence of God simply means spending time in prayer and being still before God. This practice attunes our inner eye to see the world as full of God's glory, to see other people as shining with God's love. Spending time with God, we learn to see as God sees.

To this I would add that the Catholic Church in Aotearoa New Zealand is committed to Te Tiriti o Waitangi/Treaty of Waitangi. I think that Fr Tim Duckworth's SM reply when challenged on this recently says it all: "We were there!". The Catholic Bishop of the day was present at Waitangi and engaged in the dialogue.

It takes time to work this all through. Each of the three church communities that combined into St Francis of Assisi Ohariu back in February were at different stages of introducing Te Reo Māori into the Mass.

We need to be patient with each other as we move into a shared common understanding.

As if God is somehow more present during a rousing choral anthem, a stirring sermon, or a silent retreat in a seaside resort, than God is when I'm doing the laundry, buying my groceries, sitting in bumper-to-bumper traffic or the classroom, in the kitchen or at the bedside of a sick spouse or friend.

Mountaintop Christianity is addictive, leading us to spend our days pursuing a "high" we conflate with spiritual success.

When we don't experience that high, we feel empty, unloved, angry, or bored. Meanwhile, we don't notice the ever-present God in whom we actually live and move and have our being.

Desperate for the mountain, we miss the God of the valley, the conference room, the pharmacy, the office, the school yard, the dining table etc.

Worshiping the extraordinary doesn't make for a healthy, living and encountering faith.


