Second Week of Easter 7th April 2024, Year B Readings:: Acts 4:32-35, John 5:1-6, John 20:19-31

<u>Reflection</u>

Today used to be known as "Low Sunday" – a reflection on all the pomp and ceremony of last weekend – and it was also known as Quasimodo Sunday from the opening words of the Latin Mass for that day (and of course Quasimodo was the name they gave to The Hunchback of Notre Dame because he was found abandoned on that Sunday)

Of course no Sunday is ever really "low" – always the Mass is high in God's eyes: and of course, also, no one of us should ever consider themselves to be low or abandoned. Today's Psalm 118 is full of reference to God NOT abandoning us: "God's right hand has raised me, the Lord's right hand has triumphed, I shall not die, I shall live"

But – there always times when we DO feel abandoned – well, not REALLY abandoned – just overlooked: Thomas felt that way – all the others had seen the Risen Christ and he hadn't: sniff, mutter – He's been to all the others and I've been left out – what's so special about THEM!! How come I haven't seen Him?? How come I've been overlooked? It's just not fair, NOT NOT fair at all. And the others all reckon they've seen the wounds and that great scar on His side (well, that's what they said and I don't really believe them. I'M not going to believe them unless I can see for myself – so there!!

But of course he hadn't been abandoned and Jesus came back a week later (what took you so long?) to show Thomas the fact that, yes, He, Jesus was alive and – look here, Thomas m'boy, there are the wounds so pop your hand and have a feel for yourself: See, they're real. But aren't you so lucky Thomas that you can feel for yourself – what about all those people at church in St Francis of Assisi parish in 2024 – do you think they feel abandoned just 'cos they can't see me in person, they can't stick their hands into the whacking big gash in my side?

NO – THEY DO NOT FEEL ABANDONED because they grew up in the faith that says I will never abandon them: of course they might abandon me which can be a bit rough, But I will NEVER ABANDON them!! I, the Risen Christ, will stand by them until the day they die and I will receive them into my Kingdom and they will never feel abandoned again **Tony de Joux**

Parish Council

Parishes in the Archdiocese of Wellington are required to have a Parish Pastoral Council.

A Parish Pastoral Council is essential if the parish is to develop, if it is to meet the spiritual, liturgical, pastoral and social needs of its people, if it is to be evangelising and if it is to play a part in the mission of the local and universal Church.

The role of the Parish Pastoral Council is to work with the pastoral leadership team (priest/s and lay pastoral leader/s) to plan and foster pastoral activities.

The main functions are to: 1. agree on a pastoral plan 2. collaborate with others to bring the plan to fruition 3. evaluate the results.

Members of the Parish Pastoral Council will:

- be people of prayer;
- listen to other's views;
- be concerned with the full mission of the parish;
- be willing to participate in formation for the position;
- take full part in discussions;
- be involved in the parish and keep in touch with parishioners and liaise with parish groups when required.

As we prepare to form a Parish Pastoral Council we ask that you pray for the spirit of discernment. During Eastertide, between now and Pentecost, we will ask you to nominate someone else as a potential candidate for this important role.

Our aim is a Council of about 10 people, with an even split between those nominated, and those with particular gifts and talents invited by the Parish Leadership Team.
