Support Life Sunday 2022 Accompanying and Caring for People with Mental Illness

In John 10:10 Jesus says: "I have come that you may have life and have it to the full." It is one of my favourite scripture quotes.

In the New Zealand Catholic liturgical calendar there is a special day – Support Life Sunday – for us all to focus on choosing life. This year the theme is 'You are not alone: Accompanying and caring for people living with mental illness.'

Fortuitously, Support Life Sunday closely follows New Zealand's Mental Health Awareness Week (26 Sept – 2 October) which this year took as its theme the importance of people reconnecting with the people and places that lift them up.

Our parishes and schools should be places of positive connection that lift people up and Support Life Sunday provides us with an opportunity to think about the extent to which that might be the case. Unfortunately, research shows that many parishes can do better – for example, it has been established that those living with mental illnesses are less likely to get the level of pastoral care provided for people with physical illnesses due to the stigma and fears surrounding mental illness.

One of the resources provided by the bishops this year is an **Examination of Conscience** to help us all reflect on how we can become a more inclusive and caring community for people living with mental illness (see below).

- 5. Do I ever avoid people I know who are struggling with their mental health?
- 6. Do I carelessly use language to describe situations or behaviour which diminishes or makes light of mental illness?
- 7. How can we make our parish faith community more inclusive and inviting for people who are mentally ill and their whanau?

Commit yourself to one or more practical actions you can take.
