The Body & Blood of Christ 11th June 2023, Year A Readings:: Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14-16, 1Corinthians 10:16-17, John 6:51-58

Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ

The Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ – Corpus Christi we used to call it when I was growing up – same thing. Lots of place around the world called Corpus Christi – there's a city in Texas about the same size as Wellington called Corpus Christi; there's Corpus Christi College at Cambridge University founded in 1352 and there's a Corpus Christi College in Perth - Western Australia.

And it's one of only five feasts in the Catholic Calendar when the diocesan bishop MUST be in residence in his diocese.

Enough of the history and geography! Corpus Christi – the Body and Blood of Christ is a feast instituted about 1264 by Pope Urban IV partly because he was moved by the teachings of Thomas Aquinas. So, what did Thomas Aquinas define?

He proposed the feast to emphasise then joy of the Eucharist being the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ. Great!! Now what does that all mean? It means that when the celebrant at mass utters the words of consecration the host and the wine become the real Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. THE REAL BODY AND BLOOD OF JESUS CHRIST – not just a representation. Which means that every time you receive the host you are receiving the real body of Jesus – NOT just a representation. The host is the real body.

For many today this is a bolt of a startling revelation because so many today no longer believe that fact: many believe that the host is a mere representation of the Body of Christ.

At the Last Supper Jesus knew that all the words and all the parables he had preached were of little comfort to the human body – the human body needs love and embracing and skin to skin contact (the sort that mother gives when it's late in the afternoon and the child is grizzly and what really is needed is a hug).

So, Jesus gave us the Eucharist, His physical embrace, a ritual within which He holds us to His Heart. He didn't say we had to understand it, anymore that He expects us to understand the Resurrection or the Holy Trinity: after all, when your mother/partner/great friend gives you a hug or a kiss they don't expect you to understand or to analyse it – you just know that it is a rather warm comfortable experience. And you know that you are embracing a real person – not a cardboard replica.

So it is with the Body and Blood of Christ – you aren't expected to understand but you are expected to have the faith that are receiving the Body and Blood of Christ – not a replica piece of flour and water.

If you're on a Skype call to that favourite person in your life and they give you an onscreen hug - you accept it as being real – so if we can do THAT we can accept the host as Christ in person.
