Thirty Second Week Ordinary Time 12th November 2023, Year A Readings:: Wisdom 6:12-16, Thessalonians 4:13-18, Matthew 25:1-13

Reflection

This is a parable that can be undone by focusing on what seems like "selfishness" in the prepared bridesmaids. I need to ask the help of the Holy Spirit who inspired Jesus to speak in this way to help me to listen and humbly to learn.



Reflection

Jesus tells us that there is a right time and a time when it will be too late. I ask God's help that I may realise what it is I might do now, how I might recognise the approaching bridegroom and welcome him.

Reflection

Jesus, you were in Jerusalem, close to the showdown with your people. Many of them would be like the foolish virgins, caught unawares by the Messiah. The wise virgins would be those who recognised and followed Jesus.

Reflection

For me, millennia later, this speaks of the moments of grace and opportunity: as when a great love comes into my life, or a chance of reconciliation, or an unexpected blow. It comes unexpectedly, as a shock, and can find me fumbling. Lord, give me the grace today to find you in every encounter. Make me ready to recoanise you.

Reflection

There is a time for preparation and a time for action. There is never a time for carelessness. I ask God to prepare me for the needs of this time.

Former St Benedict's Church

We officially closed St Benedict's Church in January and Archbishop Paul confirmed in his letter of 13 September that as there had been no objections to his decree the church is now relegated to profane but not sordid use.

In his letter Archbishop Paul also asked that the parish re-examine the decisions made about properties, and noted at this stage he would not be giving approval for the sale of St Benedict's Church.

Rather than leave the building vacant until the property strategy is reviewed in 2024 the Finance Committee has found another church community who will lease the former St Benedict's Church.

This is an exclusive tenancy so access to the church is now not available to any parishioners. If you have a key to St Benedicts please return it to the parish office. Many thanks. **Finance Committee.**


