Ascension Sunday 12 May 2024, Year B Readings: Acts 1:1-11, Ephesians 1:17-23, Mark16:15-20

Why do you stand looking in the sky?

Today we celebrate the Ascension of Christ Jesus into heaven. Forty days after Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples were with him near Bethany. Jesus just had finished speaking to them, telling them to "Go out to the whole world (and) proclaim the Good News to all creation." (Mark: 16). We read that Jesus was (then) taken up into heaven.

Far from continuing to stand looking up into the sky, the disciples got active; they went out among and people and travelling through many towns and countries they told their listeners the Good News of Jesus' coming into our world and showing us the way to live in love and peace with ourselves, with one another and with God.

Fortunately for those early disciples and for us today we are not alone in this work; Jesus the Christ is with us through the presence of the Holy Spirit encouraging us and guiding us by showing us with signs the way to go.

Let us today take time to read the beautiful blessing Paul wrote in his letter to the people of Ephesus. Let ourselves also be blessed and

encouraged through Paul's words to continue our work of bringing the Good News to all we meet.

May "the fullness of him who fills the whole creation" inspire us today. (Ephesians 1: 23).

Parish Council

Parishes in the Archdiocese of Wellington are required to have a Parish Pastoral Council.

A Parish Pastoral Council is essential if the parish is to develop, if it is to meet the spiritual, liturgical, pastoral and social needs of its people, if it is to be evangelising and if it is to play a part in the mission of the local and universal Church.

The role of the Parish Pastoral Council is to work with the pastoral leadership team (priest/s and lay pastoral leader/s) to plan and foster pastoral activities.

The main functions are to: 1. agree on a pastoral plan 2. collaborate with others to bring the plan to fruition 3. evaluate the results.

Members of the Parish Pastoral Council will:


- be people of prayer;
- listen to other's views:
- be concerned with the full mission of the parish;
- be willing to participate in formation for the position;
- take full part in discussions;
- be involved in the parish and keep in touch with parishioners and liaise with parish groups when required.

As we prepare to form a Parish Pastoral Council we ask that you pray for the spirit of discernment. During Eastertide, between now and Pentecost, we will ask you to nominate someone else as a potential candidate for this important role.

Our aim is a Council of about 10 people, with an even split between those nominated, and those with particular gifts and talents invited by the Parish Leadership Team.

St Benedict's Pipe Organ:

The St Benedict's organ, a much-loved parish taonga has been part of numerous St Benedict's liturgies at times of sadness and also of joy, for nearly 40 years.

A decision concerning its future at SFOA is still to be reached. The organ requires usable storage in the meantime.

We have become aware that Sacred Heart Cathedral's organ currently undergoing restoration will not be returned to the Cathedral for some time. The parish has offered to lend the St Ben's organ to the Cathedral until the Hobday organ is reinstated, or our parish needs it. This arrangement is a significant contribution for our parish to offer our mother church. It is a win- win solution for both parishes and for the organ, which will fulfil its liturgical purpose and be well cared for at no cost to the parish, at the same time meeting a need for the Cathedral.


