Thirty Third Week Ordinary Time, 13th November 2022 Year C **Readings:** Malachi 3:19-20, 2Thessalonians 3:7-12, Luke 21:5-19

"See that you not be deceived, for many will come in my name, saying, 'I am he,' and 'The time has come.' Do not follow them!" Luke 21:8

What an interesting line. What does this mean? Who are the "many" that Jesus speaks of? Are they in our midst today?

It may not be helpful to try to point to this or that person or to this or that group of people in reference to the "many" who will come in Jesus' name falsely. But it is helpful to speak to some general principles.

Jesus uses the word "deceived." There will be many false prophets who will have the ability to deceive. They will portray themselves as messengers of the truth and dispensers of the will of God. Their words will be convincing and many will follow.

This tells us that not everyone "speaking in the name of God" is in fact speaking in the "name of God." And even if many others are following, and they are very convincing, this is not proof that the person is a true prophet of the Lord.

How do we discern when someone is speaking from the heart of Jesus? Ultimately, this can only be done through prayer. This means that our hearts are attuned to God's voice. When God speaks through this or that person and our hearts are tuned into Him, we will simply know His voice as it is spoken through this or that person. I know people in our parish that give me this sense.

As a 'cradle' Catholic whose parents have long since passed, and in the second half of life, I can look back and remember rather vividly moments where my parents' instilled faith in me. I hasten to add I don't remember as it being faith as such, but those moments were seeds that have geminated and grown. I believe those moments were planned by God. He is remarkably close to us all.

Some people kneel, some sit, some remain standing. In this parish we have observed some look around somewhat confused as to what they should do.

The Cardinal has written to Parishes providing the guidance that is in the General Instruction of the Roman Missal for Aotearoa New Zealand.
