Nineteenth Week Ordinary Time 13th August 2023, Year A Readings:: Kings 19:9,11-13, Romans 9:1-5, Matthew 14:22-33

Reflection

We read in today's first reading that Elijah didn't hear God in the mighty hurricane or the rocking earthquake. Nor in the bright flames and crackling of a fire. God was heard in a light, murmuring sound. A gentle whisper – an intimate, personal echo.

In the Gospel we are again presented with the forceful energy of creation.

We can almost feel the rush of the strong wind, feel the stinging spray of the salt water on our face, the chop of the waves and the heaving of upset stomachs as Matthew describes the storm at sea.

When reflecting on these readings I was struck by the turbulence of my life and our country's and world's challenges. It is often the loudest, most critical, destructive forces that possess us and influence us. That leave us afraid and uncertain of what to do.

And I remembered that like Elijah I must go into my cave, shut out those external voices and listen to the voice of God whisper to me.

I know that like Peter I need courage and confidence to navigate the stormy turbulent waves. I must fix my eyes, heart and mind on Jesus.

It is he who shows us the way to love, serve, live and dream. He reaches out to you and me as he walks across the choppy sea of 2023 and says

"Courage, don't be afraid."

I hope to spend some time this weekend and week listening and "putting my hand in the hand of the man who stills the waters". (check out that old hymn!).

Synod

So what is the Synod, taking place over two sessions (2023 and then a year later in 2024?

The working document explains: "some of the questions" that emerged from the consultation with the People of God concern issues on which there is already magisterial and theological teaching to be considered.

To just give two examples, one can note the acceptance of remarried divorcees, dealt with in the Post Synodal Apostlic Exhortation Amoris Letitia, or the inculturation of the liturgy, the subject of the instruction Varietates legitimae (1994) of the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments.

The fact that questions continue to emerge on issues like these should not be hastily dismissed, rather it call for discernment, and the Synodal Assembly is the privileged form for so doing. In particular, the obstacles, real or perceived, that have prevented the steps indicated by previous documents from being realised should be considered and reflections offered on how they can be removed."

In short: some of the issues have been considered, and the advice yet to be implemented. The Synod will reflect on why this is so. One factor might be "a general lack of information", in which case, "improved communication will be needed".
