Second Sunday of Easter 16th April 2023, Year A Readings:: Acts 2:42-47, Peter 1:3-9, John 20:19-31

Alleluia! Christ is Risen. Indeed he is risen. He is risen indeed!

In this Easter season we are invited into the profound reality of living as people who have been given new life through the Risen Christ.

In the Entrance Prayer we pray that God will "increase in our minds and hearts the risen life we share with Christ and (will) help us to grow as God's people toward the fullness of eternal life with God."

In our first reading we read that the early community remained faithful to the teachings of Jesus through the apostles; that they lived in community, sharing what they had with those in need; and that they gathered for prayer and for the breaking of bread. (Acts of the Apostles)

We are called to be an Easter people whose hallmark is joy because "we have a sure hope and promise of an inheritance that can never be spoilt or soiled and never fade away." (Second reading, 1 Peter)

Do we let the marvel of the Risen Christ penetrate our lives and do we see the Risen Christ everywhere in our world?

Are we still sleeping in the darkness of our tombs or have we woken up, rolled away the stone that blocks us and holds us back, and courageously and with a certain kind of daring that we call faith, run from our tombs toward the Risen Christ who in the early morning stillness calls our name? Are we those to whom Jesus says in John's Gospel "Happy are you (those) who have not seen and yet believe."?

Do I truly believe that Christ is Risen and lives among us and has lived among us from the beginning of time?

I appreciate the following reflection by Lawrence Freeman OSB, Director of the World Community for Christian Meditation:



"Oh sleeper, rise up!

Resurrection is when love enters into what has died and calls it back to life, a broken relationship, a desperate failure, a broken world or a dying planet. Only love of the first order, the spring of agape, can break down the walls and weapons constructed by the illusions, pride or hopelessness of the ego."

Christ is risen. Indeed he is risen. He is risen indeed!

Good Friday Walk

A number of Churches were involved in the Good Friday walk this year 2023. Those involved were Johnsonville Union, Catholic and Brethren Churches, Tawa Union and Khandallah Presbyterian Churches. A number of people from other places joined in. Our mission to

celebrate the life of Christ is communicating itself to the people outside of our immediate areas.

There were about 150 people who walked from JUC to St John's Anglican stopping at St Francis of Assisi Catholic and Broderick Brethren Churches on the way. We also stopped at Johnsonville Mall and the Police station.

Starting at JUC we sang the Servant song and the first episode of the Passion of Our Lord Christ from the Gospel of Mark and then at each of the other stops we continued to read the Passion narrative. After each reading, we sang "Lift high the cross, the love of Christ Proclaim". From the Police Station to St John's we sang, "Jesus remember me when you come into your Kingdom", after the readings.

St John's Anglican set up a quiz with colourful posters for the children along the route so that there was some type of engagement for all in the event.

We had a large heavy cross which different groups of people carried together along the whole route. It was for all a deeply prayerful moment and celebration of our love and commitment to our Lord, Jesus.

On arrival at St John's Anglican Church, we were welcomed in the Parish Hall with tea, coffee and hot cross buns and a chance to be with each other and get to know each other better. **Ian Hamilton**
