Reflection - On Being a Pilgrim

This weekend we bless David Hensel as a pilgrim to World Youth Day.

Being "pilarim" has some characteristics we might take time to reflect on.

- A pilgrim is always moving. Pope Francis said, 'our life is a journey, and when we stop moving, things go wrong'.
- A pilgrim does not wander aimlessly.
- The pilarim is part of a wider community. Pope Francis put it this way to a group of young people in 2013, 'it is terrible to walk alone, terrible and tedious. Walking in community, with friends, with those who love us: this helps us, it helps us to arrive precisely at the destination where we must arrive!'
- The pilarim is never alone, the pravers and thoughts of loved ones are with them. The pilarim thinks often of them, and is appreciative.
- The pilgrim reflects deeply, on all aspects of life.
- Pilarimage can be painful, lonely, fun filled, social, spiritual and all of those at once (just like life).
- The pilgrimage continues despite weather, pain, tedium, hunger and thirst, and things out of the pilgrim's control.
- The pilarim sayours moments, relationships, contacts, then let's them go.
- The people one meets on pilgrimage are the real blessing. If one asks ten minutes from you, give them twenty, they probably need it, and you bless them with your time, as they bless you.

David, take with you our prayers and blessing.
