Third Sunday of Advent 17th December 2023, Year B Readings:: Isaiah 61:1-2,10-11, Thessalonians 5:16-24, John 1:6-8,19-28

"What is the meaning of Advent in our Broken World?"

In a recent article, Franciscan priest and author Daniel Horan notes it can be difficult to acknowledge the presence of Advent, let alone reflect on its significance. "Do we embrace authentic Christian hope, or do we reduce this liturgical time to a celebration of some kind of superficial and fleeting feeling of optimism? The latter, which is what many Christians think the season is about, can too easily be experienced as a form of escapism from the realities of life and history."

Quoting from the mystic, Thomas Merton, Horan argues that our Advent faith must not become an escape from the world to a misty realm of comforts and Christmas songs. "We are conditioned to think happy thoughts and prepare for the cosmic birthday party of the baby Jesus. But this kind of thinking does a disservice to the radicality of what it is we actually celebrate as a faith community that exists in a broken and troubled world."

Rather, our task is to seek Christ in our world as it is, and not as it might be. Advent is not meant to draw our focus away from the world and all that is broken about it, whether the violence of war in places like Ukraine or the Middle East, or instances of deprivation, discrimination, exclusion or harm closer to home.

Thus, Horan writes, "Advent is a time to remember that God entered this world uncoerced and willingly. Christ's arrival as a vulnerable child is an act of solidarity with all people, but especially with those who are in the most

precarious positions in society."

How will you show your solidarity with the broken and vulnerable people around you and in far-away countries this year? For Christians, that is the key measure of a Christmas celebrated well.
