First Week of Lent 18th February 2024, Year B Readings:: Genesis 9:8-15, Peter 3:18-22, Mark 1:12-15

Dear Parishioners,

The recent news concerning the state of leaky pipes through aging infrastructure in the Wellington region saw many queuing long hours for water tanks.

And yet in our throwaway society clean water is wasted and abused. Entire river systems have been drained in some countries to support profits or yields of crops, at the detriment of local livelihoods.

As a former scientist researching pollutants in the aquatic environment, it has never been more important ensuring that the supply of clean water is protected from chemicals released into the environment – often with unknown ecological effects.

But God pours on us clean water in abundance through baptism.

When the world was flooded in the story of Noah, it was God's love washing away any part of us that didn't bring life.

Perhaps that's what you feel at the beginning or end of the day when you have a shower – the aches and pains you carry are washed away, and you become a new person. Ready to face the world again as God encourages your wairua.

As we begin Lent this year, perhaps resisting temptation as Jesus did in the desert is about appreciating how resources like water have a sacred power that is intertwined with our lives.

May God continually wash, transform and convert our lives – as a people of peace, interconnected with one another. If God is ready to waste a precious resource like clean water on us for this to happen, then we must be truly loved.
