Refugee & Migrant Sunday 18th June 2023, Year A Readings:: Exodus 19:2-6, Matthew 2:13-16

"They are us ... they are Christ."

Today we celebrate a "**Day of Prayer for Refugees and Migrants**." Like me, many from our Parish are migrants or the descendants of migrants, and others have come as refugees.

My own story is that I am a first-generation descendant of two Dutch immigrants who arrived in 1955.

My personal experience of growing up in 1960's New Zealand was that cultural differences were not well-tolerated; the message I heard, consistently, was that we had to 'fit in'. I recall being teased for the different food I brought to school, for the clothes my siblings and I sometimes wore and for the fact that my parents 'spoke funny'. Consequently, many children of immigrants grew up ashamed of, and wanting to hide, the richness of their cultural heritage – a form of colonisation.

Our country has a proud history of harbouring refugees, one that includes the 733 Polish refugee children who arrived in October 1944. Their legacy is immense for our Catholic Church and our country.

Thankfully, our openness to refugees continues, albeit at a level which is less generous than many other countries.

As a parish, we can be proud of what we have done to physically assist the re-settlement of approximately 30 families from all over the world in the past 5 years.

I would like to think we have moved on from the prejudice of the 1960's. But the old attitudes still linger.



### Reflection contd......

Not too long ago, a member of our Parish Refugee Re-settlement Group reported a conversation with someone they knew who be-moaned our efforts to settle refugees. 'We should first be looking after our own,' was their comment. The inference was clear: 'Refugees are not part of us.'

This sort of attitude flies in the face of the Gospel. As Pope Francis writes in his 2023 Message for the World Day of Migrants and Refugees: "... we are called to show maximum respect for the dignity of each migrant/refugee ... constructing bridges and not walls ... the important thing is that there always be a community ready to welcome, protect, promote and integrate everyone, without distinctions and without excluding anyone."

Actually, Pope Francis goes further, stating that every migrant and refugee that comes to our beautiful land is not simply a sister or brother (truly 'one of us') but they represent Christ himself knocking at our door.

## Refugee & Migrant Definitions:

• <u>Migrant:</u>

Someone who moves to other places (in their own country or across borders) in search of better work and/or living conditions (migrants from 'Western'' countries are often referred to as expats - expatriates).



• Asylum Seeker

Someone who has left their country and is seeking protection due to a well-founded fear or experience of persecution, and who is yet to be granted refugee status.

• <u>Refugee</u>

Someone who is unable or unwilling to return to their country of origin due to a well-founded fear of being persecuted. They must be granted refugee status by a government or the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees.

• <u>Internally Displaced Person (IDP)</u> Someone who has been forced to leave their home but remains within their country of origin.
