Fourth Week of Lent, 19th March 2023, Year A

Readings: Samuel 16:1, 6-7, 10-13, Ephesians 5:8-14, John 9:1-41

The hero of the Gospel story is the man born blind. He was born blind from a physical cause, and not because either he or his parents had sinned.

Out of compassion Jesus healed him even though it was the Sabbath. People who knew the man were puzzled by his new sight. They took him to the pharisees seeking explanations. The pharisees regarded Jesus as a sinner as he had broken the Sabbath law. Sinners are not from God and cannot heal was their response. So they questioned the man, and his parents, further. They could make no progress for the healed man kept insisting "I was blind but now I see."

This explanation was unacceptable to the Pharisees for to them sinners cannot experience things of God. So the man was thrown outside.

Jesus heard about this, found the man and talked with him further revealing himself as the Messiah. "Do you believe in me as the Messiah" was his searching question. "Lord" the man replied, "I believe."

At the start the man was blind - he was in darkness. At the end of the story he is in the light, not only because he could see, but because a deeper insight caused him to become a disciple of Jesus who is the light to the world.

The story is for us all. We are all called by Jesus to believe in Him, become His disciples and walk in His light. The second reading from Ephesians reflects this. "You are light in the Lord. Live as children of the light in all goodness, uprightness and truth. have nothing to do with the futile works of darkness."

We may think that we are not good enough to be a disciple. The man of our story was blind, a beggar and an outcast. Jesus seeing his heart brought him into the light of His life.

Samuel from our first reading was sent to anoint one of the sons of Jesse as King. Samuel, led by God, ended up anointing the most unlikely of Jesse's eight sons, the youngest David.

The central lesson is that God does not choose by outward appearances but rather by a heart that is open to receiving the saving and healing love that Jesus brings to all who believe in Him. That includes you and me.
