Thirty Third Week Ordinary Time 19th November 2023, Year A Readings:: Proverbs 31:10-13, 19-20, 30-31, Thessalonians 5:1-6, Matthew 25:14-30

Today's reading from the Book of Proverbs praises the virtues of a wise, industrious and Godly woman. Such a woman not only brings blessings on her family but also on the wider community. Her contribution is considered to be beyond the price of rubies; ie priceless.

In the second reading from the 1st letter of Paul to the Thessalonians Paul continues his discussion on the second coming of Christ. He stresses that no one knows when Jesus will come again. But Paul adds that we should not be worried about being ready if day by day we are living out our faith in love and light. Doing this faithfully will keep us prepared for the return of Jesus.

In the days of Jesus His opponents wanted their Kingdom of plenty and pleasure here on earth. They did not want to believe that eventually a day of judgement would come for them.

In Matthew's Gospel Jesus told the parable of the talents as a warning for his opponents but also as an encouragement for His faithful disciples.

The servants in the parable who received five and two talents used them faithfully and well to build God's Kingdom and were rewarded. However the servant who received one talent kept his talent hidden and aave nothing to the building of God's Kingdom. The servant had his excuse but it was not acceptable as it was devoid of faith, love and service.

We are called to live out a life of faith in Jesus with love. The wise and loving woman from the book of Proverbs and the Thessalonian disciples reflecting the light of God are examples of faithful discipleship. They are using their talents for the glory of God and will receive an eternal reward.

So too must we use our talents for the glory of God.
