Fouth Week of Advent 19th December 2021 Year C Readings: Micah 5:1-4, Hebrews 10:5-10, Luke 1:39-44

4Th Sunday of Advent – Year C

The Gospel today comes immediately after Luke's account of the Annunciation – when Mary was asked by an angel to conceive a child outside of wedlock! Assured of God's favour, and that nothing is impossible for God (as evidenced by her elderly cousin Elizabeth's

pregnancy), Mary responds:

"Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word"

In the very next Gospel chapter (today's Gospel) Mary sets out for a hill country town in Judah. She is a very young teenage girl between the ages of 14-17 years.



Largely uneducated, unsophisticated, pregnant, she travels alone (probably) and in haste to visit her elderly cousin, Elizabeth. Her actions are trusting and selfless – and powerfully communicate "it's not about me!". Mary surrenders to God's will and God's power. There was no one to confirm she was on the right track, no one to reassure her that she was right. She totally trusts her own inner experience of God.

And the outcome of this young girl's trust and surrender? Well, we celebrate that next Saturday – the Incarnation, the coming of God to dwell among us, as one of us. And ultimately the Resurrection, our fulfilment in God – which is what it means to be saved. And Mary has enabled all this.

How do I compare to Mary? How is it that I can love and admire her – and not imitate her faith journey? How do I respond to God's calling of me? And what work might God bring about through me if I were to love, trust and surrender myself to God.....even just a little bit? **John Lawson**

Vigil and Sunday Masses and Word and Communion Liturgies

As we get closer to January and February 2022, I am fully aware that the holiday season begins, Covid restrictions are still in place and that over this time there will be fewer Masses, on Sundays, where there are no Priests available.

Please be assured Mass will be offered in at least one of our communities -St Andrew's, Ss Peter and Paul or St Benedict's - be it a Vigil or Sunday Mass. Hence, I encourage you to be aware of where Masses will be celebrated during January and February. Word and Communion Liturgies will also be celebrated over these weekends.

What is a Word and Communion Liturgy?

Celebrating the Lord's Day

"The people of God need to know that, even when we listen to God's Word and receive Communion outside of Mass, we are closely united with the sacrifice that continues the sacrifice of the cross within our lives." (Vatican for Divine Worship – Holy Communion and Worship of the Eucharist outside of Mass)

The Church gathers on Sunday, the Lord's Day, to celebrate Eucharist, gathered around the Tables of Word and Sacrament. The Church is sent by the Lord, to serve the common good in the world that God places before us. We are the Church the Lord assembles, to be His People.

We gather, and we pray, and we go, and we serve, we gather, and we pray, and we go, and we serve.....And the Lord calls us to be open and welcoming to the new members he sends to us. Our challenge is to engage all in mission and ministry.

In circumstances when a priest is not available to lead the Eucharist, the Church calls from its members men and women to be Leaders of Prayer (LP) and Leaders of Communion (LC).

Over the last four weeks training has taken place with parishioners from our three communities. They are already Ministers of the Word and Communion and are now also able to lead us in Word and Communion Liturgies - where a Priest is not available on Sundays.

A Word and Communion Liturgy looks very much like a Mass but is led by a presider rather than a priest, because it does not have a moment of consecration - which only the priest can perform.

At a Word and Communion Liturgy, you will not hear the words, "This is my body.... This is my blood....", instead a presider and ministers of communion, distribute hosts that have been consecrated at a Mass and then placed in the tabernacle until needed.

Our Word and Communion liturgical texts have been prepared using the traditions of our various communities across the parish, as well as resources from the Canadian Catholic Bishops Conference. We are blessed to have several choices of Prayers of Preparation, Gratitude and Thanksgiving that are suitable for our needs.

Thank you to all who have responded to the invitation to lead our communities, in Word and Communion Liturgies, when a priest is not available. I know the wonderful people of Saint Francis of Assisi, Ohariu will benefit greatly from your Ministry. **Fr Pete Roe SM**

The Fitzgerald Awards

Today we honour the recipients from our Parish with this award.

Since the year 2000, the Archdiocese has at various times honoured and acknowledged local people for their contribution to various aspects of parish



life. In 2010 these awards became known as the Fitzgerald Awards, named after the prominent Catholic layman, Dr John Patrick Fitzgerald, who did so much for the Church in Wellington, even before there was a Wellington Diocese.

John Fitzgerald was born in Dublin. He obtained a medical degree from the Glasgow School of Medicine and was a member of the Royal College of Surgeons. On 31 January 1840 he arrived in New Zealand as consulting surgeon to the New Zealand Company. Later he became Medical Superintendent of the new Colonial Hospital in Wellington. He learned Te Reo (the Maori language) and also introduced the integration of both Maori and Pakeha in hospital wards.

On his journey to New Zealand on the barque "Oriental", Dr Fitzgerald organised church services. On arrival in Wellington he found that there were a number of Catholics but no resident priest. He welcomed Bishop Pompallier to Wellington at Christmas 1840. The bishop was unable to leave a priest at that time, so Dr Fitzgerald took charge of the Catholic Community and organised services each Sunday. He did so until Dr Jeremiah O'Reily OFM Cap. arrived in 1843. Bishop Pompallier referred to Dr Fitzgerald as "the Catechist of Wellington". Eliza Fitzgerald, the wife of the doctor, was the church organist and the hostess for the many functions held in the Fitzgerald home, which for a while was the centre of Church life in Wellington (perhaps the first "Little Church" in Wellington and long before our SFOA Covid lockdown "Little Churches"?!)

Dr Fitzgerald left New Zealand in 1854. His farewell function was organised by both Maori and Pakeha. His remarks on this occasion, seem more like a Sunday homily. His listeners were exhorted to "Love God and......to be forgiving". He died in England in 1895.

Dr John Fitzgerald exemplified many of the qualities of service that are now increasingly needed in Catholic life as the number of available priests decreases. The Fitzgerald Awards are presented to people who make a significant service contribution to our community.

Covid Vaccine Passes required at all Masses and Liturgies

Wellington is now in Orange under the Covid-19 Protection framework. Everyone aged over 12 and 3 months must show a Covid MyVaccine pass when you come to a Mass or Liturgy.

<u>Orange:</u> You will need to show your Covid Vaccine pass when you arrive at the church. You won't need to book but you will need to wear a mask and scan in or register in writing.

Should we move to <u>Red</u> you will need to show your Covid Vaccine pass when you arrive. Masses will be limited to 100 people. You will need to book and must wear a mask.

Everyone over 12 and 3 months will need a pass. You can get a pass at <u>https://covid19.govt.nz/covid-19-vaccines/covid-19-vaccination-</u> <u>certificates/my-vaccine-pass/</u> If you don't have a computer, phone: 0800 222 478 and have your NHI number ready.
