### **Pentecost Sunday**

"you too will be witnesses".

It was my last day in Jerusalem. For some reason I felt drawn back to the Holy Sepulchre.

Arriving very early in the morning, I went to Mass, celebrated in the actual Sepulchre. As I sat reflecting on my pilgrimage, an Ethiopian monk arrived with an older woman and a girl of about 12, mentally and physically disabled. The monk let them into the Sepulchre, shutting the doors.

Then the doors burst open! The young girl came flying up out of the Holy Sepulchre, arms and legs wind-milling, the monk trying to catch up with her. She threw herself at me, hugged me, then sat beside me hugging my arm and stroking my shoulder. I indicated to the monk that all was OK. The older lady sat beside me. After about ten minutes the child let me go. And I wrote in my journal "this is what it's about, Christ comes when we least expect it".

I imagine the disciples had a similar experience at Pentecost. closeted away, and then that wondrous, eye-opening, mind-blowing experience.

Pope Francis puts it this way; "God infinitely transcends us; he is full of surprises. We are not the ones to determine when and how we will encounter him; the exact times and places of that encounter are not up to us".

Surprise someone!

Do something Spirit filled!

Be a witness! As that young girl was for me.



### **Parking**

### St Benedict's Pipe Organ:

The St Benedict's organ, a much-loved parish taonga has been part of numerous St Benedict's liturgies at times of sadness and also of joy, for nearly 40 years.

A decision concerning its future at SFOA is still to be reached. The organ requires usable storage in the meantime.

We have become aware that Sacred Heart Cathedral's organ currently undergoing restoration will not be returned to the Cathedral for some time. The parish has offered to lend the St Ben's organ to the Cathedral until the Hobday organ is reinstated, or our parish needs it.

This arrangement is a significant contribution for our parish to offer our mother church. It is a win- win solution for both parishes and for the organ, which will fulfil its liturgical purpose and be well cared for at no cost to the parish, at the same time meeting a need for the Cathedral


### Volunteers required at our Sacred Heart Cathedral
