Seventh Week Ordinary Time 20th February 2022 Year C **Readings:** 1 Samuel 26:2, 7-9,12-13,22-23, 1 Corinthians 15:45-49, Luke 6:27-38

Today's a day for forgiving: not the sort of "I'm sorry 'cos I bumped into your car and scratched it" - today's for thinking about the BIIIIG STUFF!!

David had every chance to butcher Saul – and he didn't, he forgave all the Saul nasties that he'd heard about and just scared Saul a bit - to be fair it was a big nasty bit but still....



And then when David wrote the Psalms - today's Psalm, maybe he was thinking of that when he drew our attention to the GOD who forgives all of us – all of the time and not just in a weak namby-pamby sort of a way – God is He who forgives ALL your guilt, , who heals EVERY ONE of your ills, who does not treat us according to our sins nor repay us according to our faults but "as far as he east is from the west so far does He remove our sins" - now that's a BIIG forgiveness and He doesn't expect us to come crawling to Him - He forgives our sins regardless.

And Jesus becomes "the Second Adam" who has the spirit as well as the soul and we are all modelled on Jesus as Paul reminds us.

And then comes the crowning idea – the Sermon on the Mount-full of

forgiveness "Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you" This is not easy to comprehend – why should you forgive the next door neighbour who's just "accidentally" ruined your fence line or chopped the branches of your trees? Why should you be nice to the fellow worker who's always making snide remarks about you? Why indeed?? MHAŠŠ

Because at heart we are actually compassionate people – we try to be compassionate as our Heavenly Father is, we try to be nice, we think up excuses to forgive other people – but it ain't easy – so we need prayer and with prayer comes forgiveness of heart and that forgiveness suffuses through our whole being and makes us just that more compassionate

SO: let's give forgiveness a go and see what happens – you might just be surprised - and remember – if you've given up on God – He hasn't given up on you and you're pretty much just where God expects you to be at this time in your life. Tony de Joux

Covid Vaccine Passes Mandatory at all Masses and Liturgies

New Zealand is now in **Red** under the Covid-19 Protection framework.

Everyone aged over 12 and 3 months must show a Covid MyVaccine pass when you come to a Mass or Liturgy and <u>masks are mandatory</u>. Social distancing is essential.

Under <u>**Red</u>** you will need to show your Covid Vaccine pass when you arrive. Masses will be limited to 100 people. You **will** need to book for weekend Masses and Word and Communion Liturgies.</u>

Bookings are essential as numbers are limited. To book your place please go to the Archdiocese website and register or click on the link

Please note bookings for weekend Masses open at **9.00am Wednesday** and close at **12pm Friday**.

Everyone over 12 and 3 months will need a pass. You can get a pass at <u>https://covid19.govt.nz/covid-19-vaccines/covid-19-vaccinationcertificates/my-vaccine-pass/</u> If you don't have a computer, phone: 0800 222 478 and have your NHI number ready.

During 2021 we progressed a review of the parish properties in response to a request from Archbishop John in 2019. He requested the review:

"... identify how many churches the parish needs to cater for its Mass count (taking into account the availability of priests and lay pastoral leaders), and the ideal location of the church or churches. For most, if not all parishes with more than one church, this will mean reducing the number of churches in the parish. Provision for accommodation of priests is part of the review."

He also noted:

"You need to be prepared to be radical in your thinking and discernment. The theme of parish amalgamation was "A Future Full of Hope". This hopefilled future will only start to take shape when we honestly and courageously engage with and answer the many questions about our buildings."

The LFT have drafted a response for Archbishop John with consideration of the consultation we had during 2021. This draft is available <u>here</u> on the parish website and printed copies will be available in each church this weekend. Appendix 2 is also available on the website <u>here</u>.

The LFT encourage parishioners to consider the draft and think about this not from their own perspective but from a whole parish perspective. Rather that think about what we have had in the past think about what we need as a parish in the future.

The SYNOD – get involved – raise your voice.

From about 310CE until very recently the only people who seemed to have any say in the Latin Catholic Church have been "men ... beautifully dressed and with a gold ring on".

Pope Francis is challenging the Church to adopt a different approach, to return to a style described by Cyprian of Carthage (c. 255CE), in 'that while nothing should be done without the Bishop and his Council of Presbyters, it is equally true that nothing should be done without the consensus of the people'. While we here in Wellington are used to synods, having had at least four in the last 40 years, and we hear of the Australian and German synods, Francis is working to build on Vatican II and re-establish this 'Synodal way' (synodality) as the normal way of doing things throughout the whole Church, and at all levels from Parish to the Universal Church.

Being synodal means recognising we are the People of God, pilgrims together on a journey, in COMMUNION with each other, and that includes Christians who don't identify as "Catholic". It means all of us PARTICIPATING in the process. And it means knowing that we are a People with a purpose – we are on a MISSION.

The synodal process itself is in three part: a time of PREPARATION, a time of CELEBRATING being the People of God participating as such, and then a time of IMPLEMENTING the outcomes of the synodal process.

Starting with a bang on 17 October 2021, the Universal Church entered into

the preparatory part of the synodal process. We will all be challenged to participate. We need to ensure that we get our submissions in by the end of April.

In my life time I know of numerous times where the People of God, that's us, have been asked our views on a particular topic, but never on the very operational style of the Church.

Exciting, and challenging times.
