Third Week of Lent 20th March 2022 Year C

Readings: Exodus 3:1-8,13-15, 1 Corinthians 10:1-6,10-12, Luke 13:1-9

Reflection

In the first reading today Moses has a close encounter with God. He is herding sheep in the wilderness - a murderer on the run from the Egyptians - when God speaks to him from the middle of a burning bush:

"Moses – come no nearer, take off your shoes – you are on holy ground!" Moses approaches, tentatively. His curiosity and eagerness is rewarded - and he comes into God's presence.

We – all of us – have this same eagerness for God's presence. It is a deep, existential, all-permeating orientation towards the numinous, towards God in whom we have our true being. As St Augustine states: "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our heart is restless until it rests in you."

It might equally be said that as God has made each one of us to share in the Divine Life – God too is restless until we rest in Him. And what God wants – God achieves. As God did with Moses – He will draw us to Himself.

There is another tree in today's third reading, the Gospel – a fig tree that is slow to bear fruit. Rather than cut it down the gardener undertakes to tend to the tree, to improve the soil, to manure it so that it will bear fruit.

This is very comforting. What God wants – God gets. He tends to each one of us to ensure that we will live, grow – and come home to rest in Him where we belong. Of this we can be sure.

Covid Vaccine Passes Mandatory at all Masses and Liturgies

New Zealand is now in **Red** under the Covid-19 Protection framework.

Everyone aged over 12 and 3 months must show a Covid MyVaccine pass when you come to a Mass or Liturgy and <u>masks are mandatory.</u> Social distancing is essential.

Under <u>Red</u> you will need to show your Covid Vaccine pass when you arrive. Masses will be limited to 100 people. You **will** need to book for weekend Masses and Word and Communion Liturgies.

Bookings are essential as numbers are limited. To book your place please go to the Archdiocese website and register or click on the <u>link</u>

Please note bookings for weekend Masses open at **9.00am Wednesday** and close at **12pm Friday**.

Everyone over 12 and 3 months will need a pass. You can get a pass at https://covid19.govt.nz/covid-19-vaccines/covid-19-vaccination-certificates/my-vaccine-pass/ If you don't have a computer, phone: 0800 222 478 and have your NHI number ready.

If you are unable to attend Mass and you wish to receive Communion at home, please contact the Parish Office to discuss possible arrangements to receive. **Ph: (04) 478 7137.**

Refugee and Migrant family support update

In our parish there are many refugees who live among us. Last weekend, Colombian families took part in a Ministry of Education-funded project targeting Spanish speaking migrant families to help them understand and fully access the New Zealand education sector.

The project is being delivered by Challenge 2000 with Jo-Anne Carley, as part of our parish outreach team, taking part.

This is a wonderful gathering and sessions will move to face to face as soon as it is considered safe.

On our behalf, Jo-Anne has also been visiting Colombian, Kurdistan and Sri Lankan families to help them in their integration with the community and she has spoken to classes in St Brigid's about welcoming refugees.

As she learns about specific needs she will use the church networks to bring together those in the migrant and refugee community in need of particular support, with others who have time, goods and expertise to offer.

This year is 100 years since Ss. Peter and Paul's Johnsonville separated from Lower Hutt and became a parish in its own right.


