Ascension Sunday 21st May 2023, Year A Readings:: Acts 1:1-11, Ephesians 1:17-23, Matthew 28:16-20

Prayer for Christian Unity

From the very outset the Christian community experienced division – these are outlined in both Luke's Acts of the Apostles and in Paul's writings to the emerging Christian churches at various locations. Over the millennium these divisions have morphed into the range of "denominations" we have today. No doubt more are yet to emerge.

In the week between the celebration of the Ascension of Jesus and the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost world-wide we celebrate a week of Prayer for Christian Unity. A series of services is prepared at one location, and distributed internationally. The National Dialogue for Christian Unity has adapted that for use here in Aotearoa New Zealand. You will see in the notices that we come together with other Christians on 23 May 2023 – ecumenically – to pray for unity, not uniformity, but unity – united in one faith that is Jesus Christ.


In the April edition of *Tui Motu* theologian Thomas O'Loughlin writes about foot washing. He speaks of the crux of what might be considered Christian unity: "How easily we recall the command to baptise (Mt 28: 19) and to remember Jesus at Eucharistic meal (Lk 22: 19), but forget the command to wash one another's feet (Jn 13: 14-15)".

Baptism and Eucharist are two of several points of separation between denominations: we have varying practises around baptism (age, setting and minister) and around Eucharist ("real presence", only by ordained, frequency, and so on).

But when it comes to foot washing what difference can there be? Foot washing is foot washing!

So, as we reflect on and pray for unity among Christians, perhaps we might focus on that which we have in common – our feet. We are, after all, People of the Way, a Pilgrim People.
