Twenty First Week Ordinary Time, 21st August 2022 Year C Readings: Isaiah 66:18-21, Hebrews 12:5-7,11-13, Luke 13:22-30



"Try your best to enter by the narrow door, because I tell you, many will try to enter and will not succeed."

"Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough."

The above are two versions of Luke 13:24 from two different Catholic sources. Entering by a narrow way and many being unable to, are the two common themes. The notion of a narrow way, and many being unable to make it through, are the two salient points being made by Jesus. Being the perfect teacher, Jesus meets his disciples on their own level.

Today we are aware of the growth of ego and becoming more resolute of our own commitments within ourselves as we approach the mid-life stage. I suspect 2,000 years ago in rural and oppressed Judea, such self-analysis may not have been front of mind following around this itinerant preacher, but they would have certainly understood the implications of passing through a narrow way. Is Jesus suggesting to them that their life's journey must be in single-file, and will indeed be very difficult?

I think in this passage Jesus wants us to shed our pretensions and false selves, and to find our true and authentic selves. He acknowledges that this is going to be difficult for many, but nonetheless this is what we are called to do. He is asking us to reduce ourselves and find our humility and further suggesting we need to muster considerable fortitude in doing so.

Last century the Trappist monk and social justice advocate Thomas Merton OCSO said "Our vocation is not simply to be, but to work together with God in the creation of our own life, our own identity, our own destiny." To know this truth Merton wrote we are to 'pray for our own discovery'.

Property review and decision

As you will all be aware by now, Cardinal John has decided that a new Mass and community centre for our parish will be developed in Johnsonville. Our churches of St. Andrew's and St Benedict's are to be closed. They and their related presbyteries are to be disposed of or utilized as the parish decides. The exciting task before us now is to develop a church for the future.

Property Project - community meetings

Your participation is essential. Meetings to discuss Cardinal John's letter and how this decision will be progressed will be held very soon. We expect to have dates, times and place confirmed in next week's Newsletter. We would like as many parishioners as possible to attend to contribute to the discussion about the future of our Parish.

Property Project – human resources

Please consider whether you have skills and experience (eg pastoral, governance, project management, property, construction, architectural, financial, legal) to contribute to the success of the property project over the next few years (and contact the Parish Office or a Parish leader).

Church closures – a Reflection

This decision to close St Andrew's and St Benedict's churches – whether we anticipated it or not - will be hard for all of us. For nearly 50 years St Benedict's and St Andrew's have been at the heart of the worship of those communities. People in these communities have been baptised, married and farewelled in these churches – and we have gathered in them for Eucharist for many years.

We should also remember that it is unlikely that the church of Sts Peter and Paul will be retained in its current form – whether in whole or in part. So, in a very real sense *each* of the historical three worshipping communities will be losing its church.

These churches are part of our lives – they are our sacred ground.

And in the natural order of things, we would only leave our sacred ground one-by-one – as we died or relocated. The ground always remained.

But now our holy ground is to be let go, surrendered by us.... and for many it will feel as though it has been taken from us.

But it is we, the people, who make ground sacred. And perhaps a way of looking at this is that we will take the sacredness, the holiness of St Benedict's and St Andrew's and Sts Peter and Paul, with us - in the temples of our own bodies - to a new place and building in Johnsonville. There we can create something new, fresh and beautiful for God and His people.

And it is not just about building a new place of worship. Cardinal John echoing Pope Francis - has called on us time and time again to look with new eyes, to radically rethink how we are to be the People of God in today's world – how we are to follow our mission.

So, this decision presents us with an exciting opportunity. To reorganise our mission and to design and produce buildings that help us achieve our mission – whilst nourishing and supporting our lives of faith.

Prayer for our Parish of St. Francis of Assisi Ohariu.

Loving God, as members of our Parish of St. Francis of Assisi Ohariu, we come before you in a spirit of love, prayer and thanksgiving.

The Finance Committee and Leadership Formation Team are pleased to present the Financial Report for the year ended 31 March 2022.

In the last financial year, we received income of \$400,838 which was up \$34,865 or 9.5% on the previous year's \$365,973.

A bequest of \$21,000 from a deceased parishioner also contributed to the increased revenue.

Our expenses were \$334,589 compared with \$334,370 in the prior year.

As a result, we had a surplus of \$57,688 and \$36,688 excluding the bequest.
