Last Sunday in Ordinary Time Christ the King Reflection

Today we celebrate the last Sunday in the Church's year. Next Sunday is Advent. We have finished the Year of Mark and next year, our readings will be from the Gospel of Luke. It's a time for giving thanks for the year we've had and at the same time, breathing a sigh of relief, that the year is over. Such a tough year!

In today's Gospel, Jesus challenges Pilate's understanding of what a king – or a ruler – is. Pilate thinks kingship is all about holding and using power. Jesus answers Pilate by saying, no his kingdom is not of this kind. Jesus' kingship is about truth and living as a witness to truth. He says, I came into the world to bear witness to the truth and all who are on the side of truth listen to my voice.

Our world is awash with strong opinions on how we should respond to important matters – climate change, the pandemic – and we are reminded that following Jesus is not about getting our own way but instead listening to God's truth and holding true to that.

Jesus, the Lord, is the Alpha and the Omega; the beginning and the end. God is with us from all time. Let's give thanks for all the good things and

the challenges we have been given this year, and as we worship Jesus - Christ the King – we people of faith and hope, look forward to 2022 and beyond.

World Day of the Poor Liturgy November 2021

On Sunday the 14th of November, we commemorated the 5th World Day of the Poor called by Pope Francis.

Pope Francis challenged us to reflect, pray and stand in solidarity with those who go without, in Aotearoa and around the world. In the St Francis of Assisi Ohariu parish, we held an input and Reflection liturgy at SS Peters and Pauls church, Johnsonville. After a period of prayer,



Daniel Kleinsman and Muzghan Samarqandi, spoke of their personal experiences of Afghanistan and of their friends and relatives who remained there in very challenging circumstances.

Sindy spoke of the loss and gain of leaving Colombia and making a new life for herself and her children in Aotearoa New Zealand. Jacob spoke of the challenges of life, the pain of those he worked with at Challenge 2000 and how he too was deeply affected by the many mental health, poverty and social issues so many face in Wellington. Kitty spoke of Te Tiriti o Waitangi from a Pakeha perspective and that of our Catholic Bishops. The truth and statistics relating to the impacts of colonisation for Māori had a big impact

on this present. Lastly Te Po Hohua, who has been involved in our parish for many years, spoke of colonisation, whakapapa and the trauma that has been passed on through many generations. The content was so amazing that the Youth Min team is thinking of offering the input again for others to hear so that as a parish we become even more informed about the causes of poverty and what our faith calls us to do. Thanks to the



Youth Ministry team for organising this moving liturgy.


