Mission Sunday - Twenty Ninth Week Ordinary Time 22nd October 2023, Year A Readings:: Isaiah 45:1,4-6, Thessalonians 1:1-5, Matthew 22:15-21

Reflection

The events of October provide an ideal context to hear today's Gospel.

October 1st our Church gathered in Rome for a Synod to discern how to be Church today.

On October 4, Pope Francis gave an apostolic exhortation *Laudate Deum* exhorting us to live our Catholic values, change our lifestyles and political paradigms and care for the earth before it is too late and we have nowhere to live.

On October 7, armed conflict between Israel and Palestine erupted again and horror reigns on the ground where Jesus and his friends walked.

On October 14, we voted and a new government is being formed to serve our nation.

So what does "give unto Caesar what is Caesar's and to God what is Gods" mean for us?

As Baptised Catholics our mission is to follow Christ – to render unto God what is God's. The challenging aspect of this is to agree: what is Gods will? What does the gospel – the good news of Jesus proclaim?

I believe that to render to God what is God's is to say YES to acting justly, loving tenderly, feeding the hungry, caring for creation, setting captives free, welcoming the stranger, sharing wealth, challenging unjust systems and constantly seeking the will of God in prayer. This is what the gospel, the church's teachings, papal exhortations and God

calls us by name to do – from the rising of the sun to its setting.

The problem is of course that "Caesar's" power in both the gospel times and in our times is incredibly resistant to change.

The "powerful" may not hear and have much to lose. And of course, deep inside us lives a little "Caesar".

Can I say yes to rendering myself to God and to my call? And to paying the price to do so?

Today, lets commit to discerning what the will of God is for us and what we can do to bring about an inner life, home, parish, country and planet that reflects this.

Maybe read Laudate Deum too?

Next Thursday, **26th Octover**, we will be having our liturgy with St Benedict's School, in the library at 9.00am.


