## **Reflection**

Humility – that's, what today's readings are all about.

But it's Mission Sunday - so how are we going to mix humility and going out preaching the Gospel.

Well, in many respects preaching the Gospel, reaching out to others is the easier task -and you don't have to go overseas to be a missionary. St Francis of Assisi summed it up succinctly- "Preach the Gospel at all times – if necessary – use words". You can't make it much easier than that. So how do you preach the gospel? – you do it by living a Christian life of love and understanding and being Christ-like to all!! Christ-like – you remember the last time you did something nice for someone else? Or gave way in the car when you didn't really have to? Or bit your tongue instead of letting fly? Aha – Christ is working in you and when Christ works in you and you do things like that – then you preach the Gospel to others. You are NOT required to stand on street corners and preach!!

Remember the Great Commission: Matt. 28:19 – Go and make disciples of all nations. And that is the church's mission statement – it doesn't say anything about inclusiveness or going out to peripheries or race or sex– it simply says "Go and make disciples of all nations" - ALL nations! And it's a command – Jesus didn't say "Look if you're in a good mood, if it works into your busy schedule today, as a personal favour to me, if you're not playing golf today – no He makes it a command – you MUST do it.

And something I remember from a very long time back "Thank God you've got the faith – Why keep it to yourself"? Indeed – why keep it to yourself? Why not share it with others? So, let your prayers bless you to the extent that when anybody sees you this week they will see Christ in you.

We are enjoined to take the Gospel to all – not to ask them to come to the

Gospel and in these times of church closures it is even more important that we take the Gospel to others by showing them a Christian way of life – if we don't do that we can hardly expect the crowds to come thronging to our churches.

That's the easy bit: Now for the humility bit. One could write books on humility but I rather like a comment one of my teachers made to a sixth form (Lower Sixth Form) class back at St Bede's College in Christchurch in 1958: initially it's quite a brutal statement but it sums up humility and life – and it doesn't care whether we are famous or not:

Fr Bernard O'Brien on indispensability: Boys, he said. We all die sooner or later and we would all like to think how great we were in life. Fill up a bucket of water, he said, make a fist and plunge it into the water: when you pull it out, the hole left in the water will be the measure of your indispensability. If we can realize that in death we will all be humbled before God as he judges us then we will be humble throughout our lives – we will never get too big for our breeches (as the old saying went) – we will live fruitful and fulfilling lives as we await the day when we face our Maker. That's the essence of humility. And that's the hard bit.

But to soften that hard bit a little – how about "Humility is being comfortable with who you are in Christ and seeking to build others up – not just yourself, living your life in the service of God"
