Palm Sunday 24th March 2024, Year B Readings:: Isaiah 50:4-7, Philippians 2:6-11, Mark 14:1-15:47

High Priest And King - And A Crucifixion

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord (Psalm 118:26).

If we are to grasp the gospel, we need to understand 1st Century Palestine.

In his book *The God Revolution* local theologian Rev. Bruce Hamill describes sacrifice in Israel as being 'upside down'. Unlike other religions, in the Jewish practice 'the blood offering becomes God's gift to the people, rather than the people's gift to God'. The priest, with the sacred name YHWH on his forehead, comes through the veil of the temple, from the holy of holies that only he may enter, and sprinkles the blood onto the people. And as he emerges they sing 'Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord'.

As Jesus preached and showed the way to bring God's kingdom 'on earth as it is in heaven', and as he made his way into Jerusalem, with the crowd singing the very psalm they sang as the priest came through the veil of the temple, Jesus was presenting a direct threat to the rule of Rome, the Jewish Temple system, and to the arrangement the Jews had with Rome whereby they could worship their own God. Everyone's getting annoyed!

A crucifixion was almost certainly in the offing! 1st Century Palestinians were very familiar with crucifixion. The crosses in our churches have tended to play down the brutal horror it was. However it was just such a sacrifice that was required if God's kingdom of love was to break through.

And break through it did! The veil of the temple was torn – the separation between God and us gone in one massive, violent act of love-filled self-giving.

The men run. The women watch and wait!

Did you know, we at St Francis of Assisi Ohariu Parish, have the option of "Automatic Payments" that helps you contribute online and not having to find notes/change every Sunday.

You can do this directly via an auto-debit with your bank or drop us an email at office@stfrancisohariu.nz and we can email you the set up instructions in creating an automatic payment (weekly/monthly) according to your convenience & budget.

No more envelopes, no more cash!! Moreover, we keep the records & you are entitled to a tax deduction certificate every year (March end) that gets you 33.33% back from the IRD at the year end for all your donations to the church.

(Example: A \$20 automatic payment per week equates to \$1040 per year. IRD gives you \$346.62 straight credit back into your bank account. but the church gets the full \$1040 to use for operating costs)

Also, if you are you not a member of our parish yet but drop in every other week and are contributing cash in the collection basket!! You too have the option to simply convert it to an envelope with your details, to ensure we keep the records and provide you with a donation certificate at the end of the financial year to allow you to claim back **33.33%** of all your support during the year.
