Second Week of Lent 25th February 2024, Year B Readings:: Genesis 22:1-2,9-13,15-18, Romans 8:31-34, Mark 9:2-10

<u>Reflection</u>

Personally I find the reading from Genesis a challenging reading. Abraham - a father prepared to offer his son in sacrifice to God. Abraham is remembered for His great faith and trust in God for his preparedness to take this step. But it is difficult not to imagine that Isaac would have been traumatised by the experience.

This incident is seen as a fore runner to Jesus dying on the cross and offering himself in sacrifice to His Heavenly Father for the sins of all man kind. Hence the reading from Romans which states clearly that God the Father did not spare His own Son but gave Him up for us all. An amazing act of love which bought for us salvation and the gift of eternal life.

The story of the Transfiguration reflects the depth of the love between Jesus and His Heavenly Father. On the mountain Jesus was bathed, was glorified, in the love and light of His Father; a love and light which transformed His appearance into something indescribable in the depth of its beauty. Then came the Heavenly voice; **"This is my Son, whom I love. Listen to Him!."**

Jesus understood the time would come when he would be executed as He and His message of faith and love was seen as a threat to the religious tradition and practice of Judaism. He also knew the offering of His life back to His Father for the sins of mankind was necessary for the salvation of all who came to believe in Him.

The Transfiguration is the turning point in Mark's gospel. Jesus now sets His eyes on Jerusalem. Before the Transfiguration, at the time of Peter's declaration of faith, and now on the way down the mountain, Jesus prepares His disciples for His death and resurrection. On the Mountain the apostles had seen the wonder of His glory with the Father; when the time came this experience would help them understand the wonder of His Resurrection.

"Listen to Him." This instruction on the Mountain to the apostles also applies to us today. We must "Listen to Jesus." Ewen Laurenson

Lenten Reflection - Week 2

GOSPEL REFLECTION: ENCOUNTERING GOD AND TIMES OF TRANSFORMATION

Jesus led Peter, James, and John up a high mountain. Mountains and cloud often signify the presence of God with his people. For example, God was present to Elijah on a mountain (1 Kings 19:8). God revealed himself to Moses and gave the Ten Commandments on top of a mountain (Exodus 19:20).

The Israelites were guided by pillars of cloud and fire in the wilderness (Exodus 13:17-22).

God continues to turn up in the lives of His people. From a cloud God spoke in a voice saying that Jesus was God's Son "The Beloved" and urging the disciples to listen to Jesus. God continues to speak to His people. The question is whether we are listening for God's voice.

Peter did not know what to say because the disciples were terrified. As we follow Jesus, we should not be surprised that as we encounter God there are times of confusion.

At times God seems close to us and His purposes seem to be clear. But at other times He seems distant, and His purposes are not clear to us. At these times we are called to have faith in God. In a similar way while they were on the mountain, the disciples encountered Jesus in a new way – He was linked to the Divine. But their understanding was still limited and confused.

Transformation always involves passing through darkness and the storms of life.

Each day we have the invitation to rely on God for what we need through prayer and reading the Gospel message.

- What might help us hear God's voice?
- How open am I to being transformed?
