Twenty Sixth Week Ordinary Time, 25th September 2022 Year C Readings: Amos 6:1,4-7, 1 Timothy 6:11-16, Luke 16:19-31



The Word of God this Sunday challenges us to place the common good and social justice at the centre of our lives. It warns us against self-centred living, personal gain and indifference to the crying need of the poor and the gaping wound of the earth. Amos was a prophet who was not afraid to speak truth to power.

In the parable that Jesus told his disciples, the rich man was totally caught up in his own affairs. He enjoyed a good life without any consideration for Lazarus who longed for the crumbs that fell from his table. Then death brought about the reversal of fortunes. Yet the point of the parable is not about rewarding the poor and punishing the rich. Rather, it is about the sense of duty and responsibility that comes with what we have been given. The rich man simply does not look beyond his own gate; he does not care.

The Word of God is a reminder to us of our collective and personal responsibility to bring about a new society and a new world where the reign of God is evident. We are challenged by the prophetic message of Amos and Jesus to confront what the Holy Father calls "globalised indifference", and to bring God's justice to those who are poor, vulnerable, discriminated against, deprived of fundamental human values. And yet it begins with me, in my own environment and relationships: each of us has something to share with someone needing help from us.

"You might be tempted to say, "I have nothing to give". That's not true. If we want to, each of us can discover that we possess inexhaustible treasures: our free time, our love, our smile, our advice, our knowledge, our peace and our words that might persuade someone who has to give to someone who has not. You might also say: "I don't know whom to give to". Just look around you: don't you remember that sick person in the hospital, that widow who always feels alone, that classmate who failed and got discouraged, that young person who is sad because they can't find a job, your younger sibling who needs a helping hand, that friend who is in prison, that new person at work who is unsure of themselves? In each person, Christ is waiting for you." (Chiara Lubich)

Let's renew our commitment to be catalysts and agents of God's reign of justice. In the words of St Paul today, "Let us fight the good fight" as we share God's life and love with others. **Anna Franceschini**

Closure of St Benedicts and St Andrews - Message from the LFT

The Parish is progressing the decision from Cardinal John that we close St Benedict's and St Andrew's Churches. To do so, the following will happen in January 2023.

The letter from the Cardinal will be made available at Masses over the weekend and also at the Parish Meeting on Sunday.

The Leadership Team have agreed that Ss Peter and Paul Church will close in early January and undergo some minor refurbishment. This refurbishment is an interim measure until final decisions are made regarding redevelopment options for this church and the wider Johnsonville site.

We will also seek a decree from Cardinal John to rename the church St Francis of Assisi.

A section of our meeting on Sunday afternoon will be to discuss the future needs of our Parish on the Johnsonville site.

Later in January we will close St Benedict's and St Andrew's and open St Francis of Assisi. Furniture and artifacts from St Benedict's and St Andrew's will be taken to St Francis of Assisi.

Special liturgies will be held for each of these milestones in our parish.

The specific dates will be confirmed later this year 2022.

<u>Ohariu Parish Feast Day</u> - The Feast of St Francis of Assisi will be celebrated on Saturday, 1st October and Sunday 2nd October.

For this Parish Feast Day, **MASS** will be celebrated in all 3 communities at the normal Mass times.



Following 10.30am Mass at Ss Peter & Paul's Church on this day, there will be a morning tea. All welcome.

Notice for Malvina Major - There will be an anointing Mass at Malvina Major, this Sunday, 25th September, at 10.30am in the Burma Lounge.

• Create something. Creating something (e.g. art) gives you a sense of purpose, which can add meaning to your life.

• **Develop relationships.** The supportive nature of spending time with others will help you to develop more of a sense of meaning in your life.

• Find purpose in pain. If you are going through something bad, try to find a purpose in it. Even if this is a bit of mental trickery, it will help to see you through. For example, if a family member is going through medical treatments for a disease, view your purpose as being there to support that person.

- Understand that life is not fair. There is nobody keeping score, and you will not necessarily be dealt a fair deck. However, life can always have meaning, even in the worst of situations.
- Freedom to find meaning. Remember that you are always free to make meaning out of your life situation. Nobody can take that away from you.
- Focus on others. Try to focus outside of yourself to get through feeling stuck about a situation.
- Accept the worst. When you go out seeking the worse, it reduces the power that it has over you.
