Fifth Week of Lent, 26th March 2023, Year A Readings:: Ezekiel 37:12-14, Romans 8:8-11, John 11:1-45

Dear St Francis of Assisi Ohariu Community,

Our Parish Vision:

We are missionary disciples of Christ, in a community of communities, being transformed in our lives and transforming others and our world.



Unfortunately, I am in Auckland this weekend and do not have the opportunity to speak with you in person.

However, I do need to speak to you all about our Parish Community in light of Cardinal John Dews letter that was distributed at our Masses last weekend on Saturday 18/3 and Sunday 19/3, referring to the change to our Leadership Model for 2023.

In December 2019 Cardinal John Dew mandated that a Leadership Formation team (LFT), be established to work with myself as Parish Administrator to create a new model of being a Church in the now and into our future. This came with accepting the need for transformation within our own hearts and to recognise new pastoral possibilities and outreach in all aspects of our parish life.

The foundation team that was appointed by Cardinal John Dew at this time were Paul Alsford, Sister Jude McGinley, John Lawson, Paul Whitehouse, Thomas Davis, Kitty McKinley, Shane Dinnan, Paul Betham, and John Kleinsman and later in February 2020 Anna Mika-Hunt and Marushka Caldeiro were asked by their St Andrews Community to be their representatives on this Team.

Following the years after, Tim Gordon joined as our Transition Manager and later Clayton Dias and Vivian Gonzales became part of the team.

Over the past 4 years several members of the original 'Leadership Formation Team' left. That included the sudden death of our well respected and loved Paul Betham in 2022.

Why I mention all these Parish Members who took up this Leadership Role over these years, is because as a Parish Community we need to deeply thank them for the aift of their time, wisdom and service to our vision.

I also wish to acknowledge the remaining members of the Leadership Formation Team being Shane Dinnan, John Kleinsman, John Lawson and Vivian Gonzales, it is my hope, when the time is right, we as the Community of St Francis of Assisi Ohariu, will gather, to celebrate and give thanks to everyone who served on the Leadership Formation Team for their generosity of beginning this journey on the Road Less Travelled.

I can assure you, that we as a Parish will now build on what has been achieved by these Members. We will continue to build and develop this work already begun and there is a need to continue with the many existing relationships, ministries, portfolios, and resources already established.

As mentioned in Cardinal John's letter, later this year Archbishop Paul will appoint a Parish Priest who will take up this role early 2024. In the interim, we will work closely with our Ministries and the Advisory Team.

In this transition, I ask that each one of you to lend a hand in this next stage of our Parish Development where you can.

This begins by looking at our gifts, what I mean is I have my gifts and you have yours. Together we can inspire and empower one another and build a community that models itself on St Francis. Most of all our Parish becomes a Parish community where we enjoy collaboratively working together, celebrating together, praying together, supporting one another and to continue to build on being a culturally diverse and inclusive community, and reach out to others who are searching and seeking for something more than what they have in their own life or faith path.

Where is God calling us to be? It is to our faith community at St Francis
Ohariu and our direction is clear. 'We are all being invited, and challenged,
to move beyond our comfort zones and to be Missionaries for Christ
together.'



Look up here, I'm in heaven

Some of us have had near-death experiences, or perhaps on occasion have thought about near-death experiences. Many of us have experienced the death of a loved one. Lazarus went one step further. David Bowie gave his modern interpretation above of what Lazarus might have experienced those 4 days in the tomb.

Orthodox tradition suggests that after Lazarus was raised, he fled Bethaney and sailed to Cyprus, become a Bishop under Sts Paul and Barnabas, and died again some years later in Larnaka.

Its difficult to imagine the full extent of Lazarus being made FREE after his resurrection. A few days later Jesus would be brutally crucified, and then whispers would begin to abound that Jesus too has been resurrected just like he was.

Lazarus' heart must be just about at bursting point with hope hearing this news. The Way was indeed underway. He knew the dangers of staying in Judea, and was spirited off to Cyprus. I can imagine he lived the fullest and most devoted life possible having been given his 'second chance'.

Imagine when the former persecutor-in-chief of the Way, Paul, crossed paths in Cyprus with Lazarus. That first nervous meeting must be one of the greatest acts of loving ones' enemies in history. We need that spirit now more than ever.
