Thirteenth Week of Ordinary Time, 26th June 2022 Year C **Readings:** 1Kings 19:16, 19-21, Galatians 5:1, 13-18, Luke 9:51-62

Reflection

There is a Māori whakataukī which is appropriate as we approach the feast day of Sts Peter & Paul while also commemorating 100 years since the Johnsonville church first became a stand-alone parish: Kia whakatōmuri te haere whakamua: I walk backwards into the future with my eyes fixed on my past.

St Peter and St Paul are two giants of the past amongst our ancestors in faith; two saints on whom we can fix our eyes as we walk backwards into the future. They are part of the faith DNA of us all because, while our personal faith aenealogies differ, tracing back through different families, cultures, denominations and countries, every Christian's whakapapa eventually links back to these two inspiring men.

The faith, leadership and courage that defines the lives of Peter and Paul touched me in a deeply personal and guite unexpected way while working in Rome in 2015. I was part of a small group who decided to visit the ancient port of Ostia, 30 kms from Rome, the place where Peter and Paul, at different times, arrived in chains, prisoners of the Roman emperor.

As we strolled along the original, well-rutted cobblestones that lead from the old port through the ruins of Ostig towards Rome, I found myself

emotionally overwhelmed by the fact that I was literally 'walking in the footsteps' of Peter and Paul who, while travelling that road, would have been aware that the outcome of their stay would likely be death – upside down crucifixion for Peter and be-heading for Paul, as it turned out.



Yet, as important as it is to focus on the greatness, faith and courage of these saints, we should not lose sight of their personalities – imperfect men with chequered pasts. St Peter's temperament led him to act impulsively at times and he let his fears get the better of him when, three times, he denied Jesus. St Paul, meanwhile, was a man with a fiery personality who started off as a bitter enemy of the young church, cheered on the stoning of Stephen and threatened death against many Christians.

In the face of my own deficiencies, focussing on the weaknesses of Peter and Paul is as important for my faith journey as focussing on their strengths.

My weaknesses do not ultimately define me, just as the Church has not let it define our memories of Peter and Paul. I can confidently continue striving to be faithful, weaknesses and all. With that reassurance, I can continue to maintain my place in my unbroken chain of faith which future Christians will one day look back on as they seek inspiration and courage for their faith long after I too have died.
