Eighth Week Ordinary Time 27th February 2022 Year C **Readings:** 1 Ecclessigaticus 27:4-7, 1 Corinthians 15: 54–58. Luke 6:39–45

With Ash Wednesday just around the corner, I am keen to plan how I will live out the 40 days of Lent in preparation for the celebration of the Lord's resurrection at Easter.

The three pillars of Lent - prayer, fasting and almsgiving - are not meant to be undertaken simply to fulfil the 'rules' of Lent. Prayer, from the heart; fasting from those things that interfere in



strengthening a relationship with God; and almsgiving with compassion for those in need will make the Lenten journey a fruitful period of renewal. A few years ago, I received a list of recommendations attributed to Pope Francis for better fasting during Lent. I couldn't source them on the official Vatican website, but these words sound like Pope Francis' and, in any case, I found them to be good recommendations that I would like to share with you: Fast from hurtful words... and say kind words.

Fast from sadness... and be filled with gratitude.

Fast from anger... and be filled with patience.

Fast from pessimism... and be filled with hope.

Fast from worries... and have trust in God.

Fast from complaints... and contemplate simplicity.

Fast from pressure... and be prayerful.

Fast from bitterness... and fill your hearts with joy.

Fast from selfishness... and be compassionate to others.

Fast from grudges... and be filled with acts of reconciliation and forgiveness.

Fast from words... and be silent so you can listen.

"Lent is a journey that involves our whole life, our entire being.

It is a time to reconsider the path we are taking, to find the route that leads us home and to rediscover our profound relationship with God, on whom everything depends. Lent is not just about the little sacrifices we make, but

about discerning where our hearts are directed. This is the core of

Lent." (Pope Francis, 17 Feb 2021)

I wish all of us a Lent full of blessings!

Covid Vaccine Passes Mandatory at all Masses and Liturgies

New Zealand is now in **Red** under the Covid-19 Protection framework.

Everyone aged over 12 and 3 months must show a Covid MyVaccine pass when you come to a Mass or Liturgy and <u>masks are mandatory</u>. Social distancing is essential.

Under <u>**Red</u>** you will need to show your Covid Vaccine pass when you arrive. Masses will be limited to 100 people. You **will** need to book for weekend Masses and Word and Communion Liturgies.</u>

Bookings are essential as numbers are limited. To book your place please go to the Archdiocese website and register or click on the <u>link</u>

Please note bookings for weekend Masses open at **9.00am Wednesday** and close at **12pm Friday**.

Everyone over 12 and 3 months will need a pass. You can get a pass at <u>https://covid19.govt.nz/covid-19-vaccines/covid-19-vaccination-</u> <u>certificates/my-vaccine-pass/</u> If you don't have a computer, phone: 0800 222 478 and have your NHI number ready.

If you are unable to attend Mass and you wish to receive Communion at home, please contact the Parish Office to discuss possible arrangements to receive. **Ph: (04) 478 7137.**

During 2021 we progressed a review of the parish properties in response to a request from Archbishop John in 2019. He requested the review:

"... identify how many churches the parish needs to cater for its Mass count (taking into account the availability of priests and lay pastoral leaders), and the ideal location of the church or churches. For most, if not all parishes with more than one church, this will mean reducing the number of churches in the parish. Provision for accommodation of priests is part of the review."

He also noted:

"You need to be prepared to be radical in your thinking and discernment. The theme of parish amalgamation was "A Future Full of Hope". This hopefilled future will only start to take shape when we honestly and courageously engage with and answer the many questions about our buildings."

The LFT have drafted a response for Archbishop John with consideration of the consultation we had during 2021. This draft is available <u>here</u> on the parish website and printed copies will be available in each church this weekend. Appendix 2 is also available on the website <u>here</u>.

The LFT encourage parishioners to consider the draft and think about this not from their own perspective but from a whole parish perspective. Rather that think about what we have had in the past think about what we need as a parish in the future.
