The prodigal son/The merciful father

Jesus came to tell us the good news about the reign of God.

And the people were waiting for the good news. But they were looking in the wrong places. They were looking for a spectacular demonstration of God's terrible power and the conquest of their enemies. Jesus had to show them where to look.

So, he taught them - in parables - that the reign of God is something mysterious, hidden, of immense life-changing value.

It's like finding a treasure buried in a field – or a precious pearl. It's like the tiny mustard seed, the yeast in dough, the fig tree in Spring.

The people had trouble understanding. Where is this reign of God? Jesus tried to answer their questions with more parables.

Like the one in the Gospel today – let's call it "the parable of the merciful father".

A father who runs to meet his returning wayward son welcoming him with open arms and forgiveness, brushing aside the dishonour and disrespect the son has shown him, restoring his place in his home, giving him back his dignity – and celebrating his return with a great feast of life!

Is this what God is like? Is this what the reign of God means?

If so - wow! This is a true revolution. The reign of God is present wherever people show forgiveness and mercy.

Covid Vaccine Passes Mandatory at all Masses and Liturgies

New Zealand is still currently in **Red** under the Covid-19 Protection framework.

Until 11.59pm, 4th April - Everyone aged over 12 and 3 months must show a Covid MyVaccine pass when you come to a Mass or Liturgy and <u>masks are mandatory</u>. Social distancing is essential.

Until 11.59pm, 4th April under <u>Red</u> you will need to show your Covid Vaccine pass when you arrive. This week our Masses **are still** limited to 100 people and you **will** need to book for weekend Masses and Word and Communion Liturgies.

Please note bookings for weekend Masses open at **9.00am Wednesday** and close at **12pm Friday**.

If you are unable to attend Mass and you wish to receive Communion at home, please contact the Parish Office to discuss possible arrangements to receive. **Ph: (04) 478 7137.**

Please note as we are in an ever changing situation, as and when we receive updates we will make sure all information is conveyed to parishioners.

If you are isolating and need support, you can call the COVID Welfare Phone Line on 0800 512 337. The helpline is open seven days a week.

When bad news weighs on us and we feel powerless before evil, we often ask ourselves: is it perhaps a punishment from God? Did He bring about a war or a pandemic to punish us for our sins? And why does the Lord not intervene?... Rather than blaming God, Jesus says we need to look inside ourselves: it is sin that produces death; our selfishness can tear apart relationships; our wrong and violent choices can unleash evil. At this point the Lord offers the true solution, and that is conversion: He says, "unless you repent you will all likewise perish". It is an urgent call, especially during this time of Lent. Let us welcome it with an open heart.
