The Rule of Rome

Throughout the gospels Peter is a person who might be described as "under development".

Yet it is Peter who declares Jesus to be "the Christ, the Son of Living God", and is then assigned a role by Jesus that has become the scriptural underpinning of the primacy of the Bishop of Rome in the Catholic Church.

That primacy has change with the socio and geo-political landscape.

When he was elected Pope, staff tried to dress Francis in the regal robes previously worn by Popes, he refused, saying, "the carnival is over".

Francis describes synodality as "journeying together – laity, pastors, the Bishop of Rome". The Synod is "the point of convergence of a listening process conducted at every level of the Church's life", "culminating in listening to the Bishop of Rome, who is called to speak as 'pastor and teacher to all Christians'".

He goes on to explain his role as Pope: "the synod always acts *cum Petro et sub Petro*" (with Peter and subject to Peter), this "is not a limitation of freedom, but a guarantee of unity", as "the Bishops are linked to the Bishop of Rome by the bond of episcopal communion (*cum Petro*) while, at the same time, hierarchically subject to him as head of the college (of Bishops) (sub petro)".

Francis does not see "himself (as Pope) above the Church; but within it as one of the baptized, and within the College of Bishops as a Bishop among Bishops, called at the same time – as Successor of Peter – to lead the Church of Rome which presides in charity over all the Churches".

We trust in faith that the promise Jesus gave to Peter will endure.

Finance Report

The Finance Committee are pleased to present the Financial Report for the year ended 31 March 2023.

In the last financial year, we received income of \$401,694 which was up \$857 on the previous year's \$400,838.

Planned giving contributions reduced by \$15,255 from \$235,971 to \$220,717.

Our expenses were \$438,078 compared with \$334,589 in the prior year. As a result we had a loss of \$47,136.

We finished the year with cash and term deposits of \$108,090 compared with \$158,932 last year, a decrease of \$50,842.

Launch Out Workshop

On 19th August some of those in formation to be Lay Pastoral Leaders in the Archdiocese participated in a workshop held at St Francis of Assisi Ohariu.



They explored baptism, marriage, funerals and the RCIA as they are implemented in practice in a Parish.

The workshop was facilitated by Joe Green, with support from Lucienne Hensel and Robyn Radomski.

<u>Synod</u>

Those participating in the Synod have before them a series of questions on which to reflect both before and at the Synod. Parishioners should read these for themselves in the Working Document.

These questions are arranged thematically. They include but are not limited to: the diversity of the Church; the ecumenical effort (the document points out it's not just Catholics who have the sense of the faith, it is all Christians); the proclamation of the gospel; dialogue with all religions, building local cultural practices into our "Roman" liturgy; avoiding "new and destructive colonialisms"; the "preferential option for young people and families"; "greater recognition and promotion of the baptismal dignity of women" "including in governance, decision making processes and in the taking of decisions"; "properly valuing the ordained ministry in its relationship with baptismal ministries in a missionary perspective"; "promoting in the Church both a culture and concrete forms of co-responsibility such that the relationship between baptismal ministries and ordained ministries is fruitful"; "understanding the specific gifts of ordained ministers within the one People of God"; "the formation of priests engaged more closely with the life and pastoral realities of the People of God they are called to serve";

What implications does lay people performing the role of community leaders have for the understanding of ordained ministry?; how the understanding of ordained ministry and the formation of priests might "contribute to efforts to prevent the recurrence of sexual abuse and other forms of abuse"; understanding the vocation and mission of the bishop; the exercise of service, authority, decision making and governance are wide ranging and include lay and ordained, priests and bishops; synodality as the norm within the Church.
