TIME CAPSULE. – Fragments from the History of Our Parish.

No.6. The First St. Andrew's Church in Newlands, 1963.

The following is an extract from the 4 September 1963 issue of New Zealand Tablet, the national Catholic weekly:

NEW CHURCH FOR NEWLANDS, WELLINGTON. – A new church was blessed and opened at Newlands, Wellington, on Sunday, August 25, by Most Rev. P. T. B. McKeefry D.D., Archbishop of Wellington. The new Saint Andrew's Church stands on a three-quarter acre section. Through the voluntary labour and other efforts of the men of the parish, including several non-Catholic residents, a saving of between four and five thousand pounds has been made on the building, which has taken about eighteen months to complete.

The section in Black Rock Road on which this new church was built was purchased in 1957. The housing construction boom in Newlands had led to congestion at Sunday Masses in the Parish Church at Johnsonville. The new church brought temporary relief from this situation. Newlands continued to grow and was established as a separate parish in 1967. Further growth led to the building of the present St. Andrew's Church in Trebann Street. With the new, larger church coming into use, the first St. Andrew's Church, in Black Rock Road, was decommissioned on 22 May, 1976. The building was sold and later moved to Bellevue School to serve as the school hall.
