ST. ANDREW on an 'ADVENT- URE' with Jesus—November 30th 2021

The life of Andrew was not about a sentimental waiting for the Baby Jesus.

His focus as with ours, needs to be on the expectations and anticipation on the adult Christ, our universal Christ, who challenges us to empty ourselves, to lose ourselves, to surrender, to unclutter our lives so as to make room in our lives for his 'presence', rather than a 'present'. Andrew was born in Bethsaida, a town in Galilee, upon the banks of the lake of Genesareth (Gennesaret).

He was the son of Jonas or John, a fisherman of that town, and brother to Simon Peter, but whether elder or younger the holy scriptures have not acquainted us.

They had their home in Capernaum, where Jesus lodged when he preached in that city. It is no small proof of the good inclinations of St. Andrew, that when St. John the Baptist began to preach penance and forgiveness in the desert, he was not content with going to hear him as others did, but became his disciple from what he heard, and copied his example.

He often returned home to his fishing trade. He was with Jesus when John the Baptist seeing Jesus pass by, heard John the Baptist say 'Behold the Lamb of God'.

So with Andrew and the apostles, in this our time, we too acknowledge the dignity of each human person. We too say, behold the lamb of God, present among us, in all our encounters.

Here we have a splendid secret that shows us how to dream and to turn our life into a wonderful advent-ure. No one can face life in isolation. Like the early communities of Christians, that Andrew was part of, we too need a community that supports and assists us, in which we can help

one another to keep looking ahead at new vistas of new possibilities.

How important it is to dream together... By ourselves, we risk seeing mirages, things that are not there.

The Leadership Formation Team and Parish Lituray Advisory Group are developing new procedures for Masses and Liturgies to manage the ongoing risk of COVID.

Covid vaccine passes required at all masses and liturgies from Friday 3 December

On Friday 3 December Wellington will move to either Orange or Red in the Covid Protection framework. Everyone aged 12 and over must show a Covid MyVaccine pass when you come to a mass or liturgy.

Orange: You will need to show your Covid Vaccine pass when you arrive at the church. You won't need to book but you will need to wear a mask. **Red:** You will need to show your Covid Vaccine pass when you arrive. Masses will be limited to 100 people. You will need to book and must wear a mask.

Everyone 12 and over needs a pass. You can get a pass at https:// covid19.govt.nz/covid-19-vaccines/covid-19-vaccination-certificates/myvaccine-pass/ If you don't have a computer phone 0800 222 478 — have your NHI number ready.

If you're not vaccinated there will be special masses somewhere in Wellington where you won't need a pass. These will be advertised when it's been decided where they will be.


