Finance Committee Update and Office Hours Changing

The Finance Committee spoke at Masses last November about the need to increase giving from parishioners and other cost reduction plans being put in place to ensure financial sustainability.

We would like to thank the parish for the generous increase in giving. We appreciate all those who give and are pleased to report the financial situation has improved.

The Office hours are changing, and the office staff will no longer be working on Fridays and therefore the office will be closed that day.

This decision was taken after consultation with the office staff and agreement reached that Friday as a non-workday is best for them in a requirement to reduce hours. The parish still operates with considerably longer hours per week than any other parish in the Wellington Archdiocese.

The Finance Committee will work with the new Parish Priest to review the tasks that should be undertaken by parishioners, such as reinstating a Counters Roster for weekly giving, and other tasks normally undertaken by parishioners, in a bid to relieve the amount of work currently placed on the office.

The phone remains always monitored in the case of emergencies.

- At 4.30pm Gerry, Alfred and Quang and their supporters will be called (karanga) into the Church.
- Our speaker (kai korero) will address them, then a waiata/song.
- Their kai korero will respond, followed by waiata.
- Gerard, Alfred and Quang will be handed over.
- Anna will speak on behalf of the Parish.
- We will then move into the 5pm Mass- this will be followed by a cuppa and shared food.
- At this Mass, Pa Gerry, Fr Alfred and Joe will be commissioned as our new Parish Leadership Team - this is as per placement letter included in our last newsletter (24th Dec 2023). Click here for the letter.

Some Key Points:


