Fifth Week of Easter 28th April 2024, Year B Readings:: Acts 9:26-31, John 3:18-24, John 15:1-8

Dear Parishioners,

We marked Anzac Day during this past week. Always a time to think about the casualties of war. One thing I didn't realize was that there were 15,000 Indian soldiers killed at Gallipoli as well as other nationalities that were part of the British war forces. The Anzac services can arouse in us a sense of grief for losses both in the relatively distant past, and more recently, whether during war or not.

Our world is not short of current wars, both ones with plenty of media coverage (Holy Land, Ukraine) and those without (West Papua, Myanmar, Sudan, Congo). Plus myriad 'war-like' situations in Central African republic, Nigeria, Mozambique, etc. Then there is the 'war on the poor' caused by the various economic situations and structural arrangements across the world.

And the war on earth, water and air that our current economic, technological and industrial systems continue to perpetuate, means we are all caught up in a 'war'. Pope Francis calls it a 'third-world-war, fought piecemeal'. I thought this image was a bit fanciful as I imagined the first 2 world wars as involving large-scale battles whether on land, sea or air, specific sites, fixed positions, etc.

But warfare is changing to guerrilla tactics, cyber weapons, unmanned vehicles (eg, drones), paralyzing infrastructure, (energy, communications networks). A bleak picture. Yet the resurrection of Christ we celebrate over 50 days means Christ brings us peace at various levels. And makes us seek peace, be makers of peace in this world, whether through dialogue, listening, justice advocacy, disarmament work.

<u>Parish Council</u>

Parishes in the Archdiocese of Wellington are required to have a Parish Pastoral Council.

A Parish Pastoral Council is essential if the parish is to develop, if it is to meet the spiritual, liturgical, pastoral and social needs of its people, if it is to be evangelising and if it is to play a part in the mission of the local and universal Church.

The role of the Parish Pastoral Council is to work with the pastoral leadership team (priest/s and lay pastoral leader/s) to plan and foster pastoral activities.

The main functions are to: 1. agree on a pastoral plan 2. collaborate with others to bring the plan to fruition 3. evaluate the results.

Members of the Parish Pastoral Council will:

- be people of prayer;
- listen to other's views;
- be concerned with the full mission of the parish;
- be willing to participate in formation for the position;
- take full part in discussions;
- be involved in the parish and keep in touch with parishioners and liaise with parish groups when required.

As we prepare to form a Parish Pastoral Council we ask that you pray for the spirit of discernment. During Eastertide, between now and Pentecost, we will ask you to nominate someone else as a potential candidate for this important role.

Our aim is a Council of about 10 people, with an even split between those nominated, and those with particular gifts and talents invited by the Parish Leadership Team.
