Pentecost - The Great Conspiracy 2023

Early records of the word "conspire" say the word comes from the Latin conspirare, con - together and spirare - to breathe. So the word conspire means to breathe with or to breathe together – in unison.

In today's world there are many conspiracy theories. Here's another to consider as we gather as brothers and sisters in our faith community.

Pentecost is the day when we celebrate and are inspired and motivated by the Jesus-humanity conspiracy. The day Jesus conspired with his disciples and the day he now conspires with us – you and me.

By becoming human Jesus had already showed his great love, understanding and confidence in his human family.

Pentecost took this confidence to another level. He gave us the Spirit. He breathed on us and we breathed with him. It was great for the Parish to come together in such a fun, social way.

The Refugee Fund received a magnificent \$700 and SPCA welcomed a donation of \$300, from the proceeds.

The funds for the Refugee fund are very timely as the parish just this week set up the 27th house (since 2015).

Each house is supplied with electrical equipment such as microwave, vacuum cleaner, toaster, jug, iron etc, all the items in the kitchen, including a full food pantry, and all linen including towels, tablecloths, blankets, duvets, new pillows/mattress protectors and other things to make a house a home. The latest incoming refugee family moved in on 19 May.

Why do People in Anger Shout at Each Other ?

When two people are angry at each other, their hearts are distant from one another.

To cover that distance they must shout to be able to hear each other. The angrier they are, the stronger they will have to shout to hear each other to cover that great distance.

What happens when two people love each other? They don't shout at each other but talk softly, because their hearts are very close. The distance between them is either non-existent or very small...

When they love each other even more, what happens?

They do not speak, only whisper and they get even closer to each other in their love. Finally they need not even whisper, they only look at each other and that's all. That is how close two people are when they love each other.

So when you argue do not let your hearts get distant, do not say words that distance each other more, or else there will come a day when the distance is so great that you will not find the path to return.

FOR REFLECTION: What do you make of the relation between the intensity of communication and the closeness of hearts?

When we find ourselves in a situation where we are either shouting or being shouted at, how might we transform the situation and bridge the distance that has developed?
