Twenty Second Week Ordinary Time, 28th August 2022 Year C Readings: Ecclesiasticus 3:17-20,,28-29, Hebrews 12:18-19,22-24, Luke 14:1,7-14



Today's scripture readings make us think hard about who we are, and how we act.

Ecclesiasticus says the greater we are the more humbly we should behave. We should treat everyone with love and respect.

The teaching of Jesus goes deeper than this. In the Gospel of today Jesus is invited to a dinner which has an agenda other than hospitality. His actions were closely watched so that maybe he could be accused as a law breaker. Jesus responds by healing the man with dropsy to again show that the law that really matters is the law of love.

Jesus then gives us two parables. In these Jesus teaches us that the only status that counts is the nature of our relationship with God and with others. Our real status is measured, not by race, gender, education, occupation or wealth but by our love for God and our love for others, and especially for those who are in need.

What counts is not how we are looked upon by others, but with the degree of care and compassion with which we look at them.

The teaching of Micah in the Old Testament comes to mind. "What does God require of us; it is to act justly, love tenderly and to walk humbly with God." (Ch. 6 v 8) Jesus' parables, in a powerful manner, restate this message.

The wonder is that when we humbly live a life of love of God and of others we enter into the heavenly Jerusalem, the city of the living God joining thousands upon thousands in joyful assembly; in this life and in the life to come. (Hebrews 12; 22-24)

Our school/Youth Ministry Liturgies begin at **9:15 am on a Tuesday.** 


