Thirty First Week Ordinary Time, 30th October 2022 Year C **Readings:** Wisdom 11:22-12:2, 2Thessalonians 1:11-2:2, Luke 19:1-10

Welcome him joyously.

We are all familiar with the Gospel story of Zacchaeus; a tax-collector, well placed to get rich by adding a percentage, and he did get rich. He tells us how he got rich – by defrauding people, by taking four times as much – this is what he promises to pay back.

Zacchaeus had heard about Jesus, he wanted to see Jesus, and he made an effort to do so. Zacchaeus is a "big man" about town, however he is short – so he does an undignified thing and climbs a tree.

But the thing that leaps out in this story is firstly that Jesus saw Zacchaeus, and knew who he was, and in that way, what he was - a sinner.

The second thing that stands out is that Jesus invites himself to stay at Zacchaeus' house. In a hospitality society the hosts would usually sort out among themselves where the arriving quests would stay.

Not in this story: Jesus looks directly up at Zacchaeus, AND INVITES HIMSELF. Zacchaeus responds to that invitation – he gives away his possessions and makes right what he shouldn't have taken, and more.

And then Jesus gives Zacchaeus even more: he recognises him as a "son of Abraham". In doing so he declares that Zacchaeus is no longer an outsider, he is forgiven.

Jesus does for us what he did for Zacchaeus: he recognises us; calls us by name; knows who and what we might be; and, despite that, invites himself to come stay with each of us.



All we have to do is, like Zacchaeus, "welcome him joyously".

TIME CAPSULE. - Fragments from the History of Our Parish.

No.4. The Church of the Holy Name in Ngaio, 1912.


On December 20, 1910, a building application was submitted to the Onslow Borough Council for a church to be erected on Section 48 in Nagtoto Road. The submitted plans, now in Wellington City Archives, show the internal dimensions of the small church were 18 feet wide by 28 feet deep. The front of the church had a cross atop the gable above the single door and four wooden steps providing the only access and exit. The side walls had two windows each, and the back wall a single window. The builder was Mr P. C. Watt of Berhampore. Originally known as "The Church of the Holy Name", it was recalled that Father Thomas Walsh celebrated the first Mass in the (probably uncompleted) church in December 1911. Father Walsh also officiated at the first marriage ceremony held there on 10 April 1912, just a few weeks after it was formally opened on 24 March. The district then was part of the Lower Hutt Parish. By the time the church was enlarged in 1929 it was known as St. John's Church and was part of the Johnsonville Parish. For a number of years, some locals continued to refer to it as the Church of the Holy Name. Further enlargements in 1936 allowed the older parts of the church to be used as classrooms. St. John's was the first Parish Church of the new Onslow Parish established in 1950. In 1992, when further alterations were carried out, the remnant of the original church formed part of the parish hall. St. John's was closed following the last Mass there on Sunday 20 May 2012. The building was sold and demolished; houses now occupying the site. Yet remnants of the building live on; the large cross in St. Benedict's Church was crafted using timbers from St. John's.

[Footnotes: Ngatoto Road – later Ngatoto Street – is variously described as being in Ngaio, Nairnville or Khandallah. The church's street address was 36 Ngatoto St. Father Walsh's surname was sometimes rendered Walshe.]


