Fourth Sunday of Easter 30th April 2023, Year A Readings:: Acts 2:14, 36-41, Peter 2:20-25, John 10:1-10

Reflection

In his sermon on Easter Sunday, Fr Pete spoke of the need for us all to leave our empty tombs behind and push out into the future. After all Jesus left HIS tomb behind so that He could get on with the business of saving us all. And if Jesus can leave his tomb, then we can leave ours.

Not so easy as it sounds: how do we leave our empty tombs? Indeed, how do we even know what our tombs are. And it's awfully hard changing direction even if it's only a very slight change of direction.

I really can't help with your empty tombs but I can make some suggestions: who remembers at school examining their conscience? That good time to quietly have a look at your spiritual lives – an examen that's carried out quietly in the silence of your mind, a chance to reflect on the good and bad of our lives. Well and good, that's probably the easiest bits of the new direction.

The early apostles had the risen Jesus to give them faith and hope and a guiding hand into their futures, but they also had each other. And they had their faith and as Jesus said to Thomas "Blessed are those who have not seen and still believe". Well, YOU have faith: if you didn't then you wouldn't be here today – your very presence is a bright shining example of your faith. And the apostles had each other; and we have each other. The readings this Fourth Sunday are heavy on being shepherds. We hear from the readings how much we can depend on Jesus to be there and He has promised that He will always be there for us: He is our guiding light in life. If we reach out to Jesus for assistance in our spiritual lives, He will always help us.

But maybe one of the more difficult paths to follow might be a suggestion made by Pope Francis recently:

"There are many who still seek religious security rather than the living and true God, focusing on rituals and precepts instead of embracing God's love with their whole being. Those who seem to be afraid to make

progress and who regress because they feel more secure - they seek the security of God and not the God of our security. Like the Galatians they should return to what is essential – God"

Well, I'm going to say that description fits me reasonably well so one of the empty tombs that I need to leave behind is that reliance on the security of the rituals and precepts. Rituals and precepts are like money – it's not what you have but what you do with what you have.

Do you have an empty tomb that you can leave behind?

PS – Actually Galatians is quite a good read – and it's short as well – only 6 chapters.
