Mary's Easter Monday Letter

Dear Son.

When you ran into the yard, I didn't know whether to hug you or smack you. I was exhausted after the heartbreaking week.

It began well. Crowds supporting you, welcoming you as their leader. Cheering and clapping. Then sharing that special, strange meal, when you held up bread and wine, saying: "eat and drink this after I've gone and always remember me".

You, our friend and leader knelt down servant - like, to wash feet – mine included! No, no stop you can't, we shouted embarrassed and shocked. You said to us and Peter "well if you don't let me, you've missed the whole point of my life and you can't be with me – friendship and my succession plan is over – understand please, **you must do what I do!**" Peter energetically responded: "okay then Lord, wash all of me"! It was all very, very intense. Taking my hand then, you whispered that you needed alone time, to pray and agin strength for the rest

of the week

Tired I went home and I regretted that the next day when I saw you betrayed, captured, tortured and mocked. Covered in blood with the people you had helped screaming "crucify him."

The self-centred, power hungry rulers worked hard to get rid of you because they wanted everything to remain the same and you threatened their worlds.

The rest is a blur. I remember standing (with John's help) beneath your cross ,weeping until I had no tears left.

I knew then what Simeon meant when I took you to the temple when you were little, when he told me a sword would pierce my heart.

Your friends stuck together that night – scared, afraid and traumatised. Our shared dreams and plans for a city, country of peace, justice, love, and hope shattered in pieces like one of my little clay pots that you dried so often.

Then miraculously here you were alive in our yard, straight from the tomb. Smiling and calling my name. What absolute JOY, welled up inside me. And when you left me to visit the others I sat to write you this note.

So son I'm off to Ephesus with John soon. I want you to know that I am so proud of you and grateful that you showed us and humanity, that love can overcome hate, peace can overcome conflict, healing can transform pain, hope overturns fear, forgiveness sets everyone free and light will extinguish all darkness. I will always carry you inside me and I remain your first disciple.

And my hope and prayer is that all who bear your name through the generations, follow your example and have the courage and grace to do what you did, love as you loved and serve as you served.

Love you always Mum.

Holy Week



Holy Thursday (sometimes referred to as Maundy Thursday after the Latin mandatum or command to love one another, is a day when Christians commemorate the Last Supper of Jesus.

In some traditions, there is the washing of the feet of various members of the community to recall a gesture of Christ at the Last Supper when he washed the feet of his disciples. This is a sign of the need to do more to love one another and to serve all people, especially the poor.



Good Friday is a solemn day on which Christians recall the death of Jesus and its promise of hope and new life. In some traditions a wooden cross is set up and people spend time meditating before it.

Other people make the Stations of the Cross a devotion that recalls the journey of Jesus on the Via Dolorosa (Way of Sorrows) in Jerusalem to Calvary where he was crucified. (In Jerusalem the place of Christ's death and resurrection is commemorated inside the Church of the Holy Sepulchre.)

Many Christians keep this devotion but also see in the suffering of Jesus a reminder to be more concerned for the suffering of people in today's world. For many Christians, this day is also a day of fasting and penance.



Easter Sunday

Easter Sunday is the greatest feast in the Christian calendar. While our society puts a major emphasis on Christmas, no other day is traditionally as sacred for the Christian community as Easter. This is the day Christians

commemorate the resurrection of Christ.

In some traditions, the services begin the night before with the lighting of a new fire and the blessing of a large Easter candle. Water is blessed and many are baptized. But for all Christians, this is a day to renew one's faith.

In the Catholic Church, there is a sprinkling of all people with the newly blessed Easter water as a sign of renewal of our baptismal commitment. In many Protestant communities, Easter is celebrated at a sunrise service early on Easter morning. Easter usually ends with festive celebrations with special foods and Easter delicacies.
