The Rite of Celebration of the Word with Holy Communion outside the Mass

The Church has long provided for the Celebration of the Word and Holy Communion outside the Mass as part of wider Eucharistic worship – it is one of the Rites of the Catholic Church and gives the faithful access to Holy Communion. Not enabling the Rite to be used when necessary might, arguably, equate to refusing the faithful access to Communion.

As our start point we remember that the celebration of the Eucharist in the Mass is the very centre of the Christian life, for the Eucharist contains the Church's entire spiritual wealth, that is, Christ himself. The celebration of the Eucharist in the sacrifice of the Mass is truly the origin and purpose of the worship that is shown to the Eucharist outside the Mass.

Christ is present in the celebration of the Mass in four ways: in the assembly of the faithful; in the Word; in the person of the Priest; and finally and above all in the Eucharistic elements. In the Celebration of the Word and Holy Communion outside the Mass Christ is present in three of these four ways – therefore this is not a Mass, and does not substitute for the Mass. It is however Eucharistic worship in its own right.

The rite for Celebration of the Word and Holy Communion outside the Mass provides that the minister may be ordained or lay. Lay people appointed to lead worship of the Eucharist, including Celebration of the Word and Holy Communion outside the Mass carry out this responsibility by virtue of their baptism and confirmation.

Lay led ministry does not replace the ordained ministry, but works in collaboration with it to enable the faith community to gather as the Body of Christ, and to be nourished by both the Word and Holy Communion. In unforeseen circumstances, and indeed in many parts of the world, this occurs at the Sunday celebration in the absence of a priest.

It is important to always remember that the Eucharistic celebration in its fullness cannot take place without a priest, and that the Eucharistic communion received during the Rite of Celebration of the Word with Holy Communion outside the Mass, whether led by an ordained or lay minister is closely connected to the Mass.

The wording in the rite reminds us of this.

Property Review Decision from Cardinal John

Dear fellow parishioners,

We know that a clear path forward has been years in the making – and for many it has been years in the waiting! Acknowledging this, the LFT wish to report that Cardinal John has now responded to our SFOA parish property review and proposal.

Copies of + John's letter are available in the foyers of our churches and on request from the Parish Office.

Decision:

After consulting with his Council of Priests, +John has given his decision that our Parish's main centre of worship – our church for the future – should be situated in Johnsonville.

In communicating his decision +John has made the following main points:

- Our future church should be able to accommodate the weekend Mass count in no more than two Masses.
- Consideration should be given to closing St Benedict's and St Andrew's in the near future. (No timeframes are specified.)
- Maintenance expenditure on these two churches should be avoided.
- What happens with the Newlands and Khandallah properties (churches and presbyteries) will be determined by the parish.
- Time frames proposed by the parish for actions should be shortened. Major change benefits from momentum.
- The parish should provide resources to ensure accommodation for a Diocesan Priest.
- Future needs of the two schools and Catholic education must be considered.
- Priority should be given to funding a new church without debt.

- Many difficulties and issues arise around parish involvement in social housing. Any involvement needs to be deeply considered.
- In due course, consideration should be given to possible Parish boundary changes to bring Crofton Downs (and possibly Ngaio) within either the Otari or Cathedral parish (because of those suburbs' closer proximity to their churches).

Next steps:

These decisions - whether or not anticipated - will bring great sadness and sense of loss to many. There will be lots of questions about the implementation of the decision and +John's related recommendations. At this stage we may not have all the answers.

Over the next few weeks – and to the extent that COVID restrictions allow – we will hold public meeting(s) for the Parish to consider these decisions/ recommendations, their implementation and their consequences (especially pastoral).

We will also prepare and post on the Property Review page of the parish website a list of FAQs and their answers.

The LFT will work towards establishing a governance group to manage the various work streams that will need to be progressed as a result of this decision. Details of each work stream will be available in the next few weeks. It will be essential that parishioners are involved. Please consider if you have skills and experience to contribute to the success of this in the next few years (and contact the Parish Office or a Parish leader).

Finally:

...and above all, we would ask you to:

- mull prayerfully over +John's decision and recommendations,
- embrace this new direction for our local church here in St Francis of Assisi Parish,
- see it as a time of grace, gratitude, growth and HOPE!
- support and love one another and particularly those of us who will experience this as a time of grief and loss.
