Sixth Week of Easter 5 May 2024, Year B Readings: Acts 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48, 1 John 4:7-10, John 15:9-17

"For the love of God.....!"

The above idiom is often said in a time of frustration and impatience at someone who has been 'beating around the bush'. You implore them to act urgently on your request. For example, "for the love of God, turn that TV off, it's driving me mad!", when you are focusing on working quietly.

Often as humans we wrongly judge how much others love God by how well they respond to our own selfish needs. Additionally, we can idealise God as a master that needs to be pleased. However, neither of these things define our Christian lives.

The only acts in our lives which we must attend to with urgency is allowing those who are nuisance 'pagans' in our mind be embraced by the warmth of their rightful inheritance - that God loves them as much as God loves me. Irrespective of how 'imperfect' that person is to me, or whether or not I think they please God very well, they have God's full care.

That's why the call "for the love of God" is no different to the call "for the love of the other person". In our moments of frustration, God's love "is patient and kind and not boastful". This stands as a litmus test of how little our faith is about pleasing God or others so that we have a good reputation in front of people. Our faith is about how, when people see our own example, they experience God's love for them.

<u>Parish Council</u>

Parishes in the Archdiocese of Wellington are required to have a Parish Pastoral Council.

A Parish Pastoral Council is essential if the parish is to develop, if it is to meet the spiritual, liturgical, pastoral and social needs of its people, if it is to be evangelising and if it is to play a part in the mission of the local and universal Church.

The role of the Parish Pastoral Council is to work with the pastoral leadership team (priest/s and lay pastoral leader/s) to plan and foster pastoral activities.

The main functions are to: 1. agree on a pastoral plan 2. collaborate with others to bring the plan to fruition 3. evaluate the results.

Members of the Parish Pastoral Council will:

- be people of prayer;
- listen to other's views;
- be concerned with the full mission of the parish;
- be willing to participate in formation for the position;
- take full part in discussions;
- be involved in the parish and keep in touch with parishioners and liaise with parish groups when required.

As we prepare to form a Parish Pastoral Council we ask that you pray for the spirit of discernment. During Eastertide, between now and Pentecost, we will ask you to nominate someone else as a potential candidate for this important role.

Our aim is a Council of about 10 people, with an even split between those nominated, and those with particular gifts and talents invited by the Parish Leadership Team.
