

Easter Reflection

The Holy Week Diary

Day 1 Sunday

After the crowd going wild, waving palms and shouting *Hosanna Son of David*, we spent the night in Bethany with Martha and Mary and Lazarus, (who is, incidentally, looking remarkable, all things considered.)

Day 2 Monday

Back to Jerusalem. Jesus cursed a fig tree because it hadn't borne any fruit. Bit tough on the tree.

At the Temple, the courts were full of corrupt money changers. Jesus went ballistic - overturning their tables and shouting things like, "the Temple has been turned into a den of thieves" He's not making any friends!! Stayed in Bethany again.

Day 3 Tuesday

Back to Jerusalem.

At the Temple, the religious leaders were upset that Jesus had set himself up as a spiritual authority. They were getting organized wanting to place him under arrest. Jesus didn't help', calling them "Blind guides- Snakes! Sons of vipers! Who will be iudaed by Hell.

Later that afternoon, we went up to the Mount of Olives. Jesus went on about the destruction of Jerusalem, speaking in parables and symbolic language, I got a bit lost really -on about the end times and His Second Coming and the Final Judgment.

Returned to Bethany to stay the night. Judas stayed in the City.

Day 4 Wednesday

Spent the day resting in Bethany. The Locals are big fans.

Day 5 Thursday

Jesus sent Peter and John to set the Upper Room for the Passover Feast. We all gathered after sunset. It was Jesus who washed our feet. He does not just say that we should love one another—he actually walks the talk. For all the attention he gets, he is a humble guy.

We shared the feast. At the last blessing cup he told us to remember him in the fu-

ture by sharing the bread and wine.

It was late when we went to the Garden of Gethsemane, to pray together. I must admit I nodded off and woke up to see Jesus being arrested by the Sanhedrin. It was a set up and Jesus was taken to the home of the High Priest, where the whole council had gathered to begin making their case against him. We had warned him.

Day 6 Friday

Worse day ever.

I heard that Judas Iscariot hanged himself. Apparently, he had ratted Jesus out. After multiple unlawful trials, Jesus was sentenced to death by crucifixion. Roman soldiers nailed him to the wooden cross on Calvary. Those who were there said that his last words were "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit." By the time the Sabbath began Nicodemus and Joseph of Arimathea had taken Jesus and laid him safely in a tomb.

Day 7 Saturday

It gets a bit sketchy – we all instinctively found each other last night and locked ourselves away. We heard that the body was guarded by Roman soldiers. When the Sabbath ended at 6 p.m., Jesus' body was ceremonially treated for burial.

Day 8 Sunday

Early this morning, several women (Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Salome, and James' Mother) went to the tomb. Now they reckon that the large stone covering the entrance had been rolled away. They say that they were told that Jesus had risen from the dead. I reserve judgment.

St. Francis of Assisi pray for us, and guide us.




O Risen Lord. In your resurrection you bring light from darkness, life from death. Strengthen us, your servants, sent to proclaim this good news among your people today.
