Food for the Journey



Here's food for thought... After a long day of work or school, the first thing that I would do is go through the pantry looking for something to eat or drink. This is a reminder on the importance that food will replenish us physically and ensure that we stay nourished and hydrated.

As we gather for mass each weekend, we join together to celebrate by listening to the stories that are shared through the readings and through the breaking of bread during Communion. It is by receiving the body and blood of Christ that we are replenished Spiritually.

In today's Gospel, Jesus says to the crowd on the boat "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty".

It is through our faith and works of God that we received Jesus, through the breaking of bread. We are challenged to share this with others.

Do you have a Unifying and Animating Presence? Background Information:

In our Parish, setting up and meeting the Pastoral needs of the Parishioners is a large part of my role.

Our Parish Vision:

We are baptised disciples of Christ, a Catholic Community of communities commissioned to transform our world.

Pope Francis Vision: Evangelii Gaudium, from paragraph 28)

"The parish is the presence of the Church in a given territory, an environment for hearing God's word, for growth in the Christian life, for dialogue, proclamation, charitable outreach, worship and celebration. [27] In all its activities the parish encourages and trains its members to be evangelizers.[28] It is a **community of communities**, a sanctuary where the thirsty come to drink in the midst of their journey, and a centre of constant missionary outreach. We must admit, though, that the call to review and renew our parishes has not yet sufficed to bring them nearer to people, to make them environments of living communion and participation, and to make them completely mission orientated."
